

## CHAPTER

436 NOT PASSED

No. **AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 666, BY ADDING THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY (\$139,750) DOLLARS TO POLICE DEPARTMENT, ITEM 0, AND ONE HUNDRED FORTY-THREE THOUSAND (\$143,000) DOLLARS TO FIRE DEPARTMENT, ITEM 0.

*Approved*

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 666 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 22, 1952, and entitled "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$28,328,060.70 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1953" is hereby amended by adding the sum of one hundred thirty-nine thousand seven hundred fifty (\$139,750) dollars to the appropriation for Police Department, Item 0, and one hundred forty-three thousand (\$143,000) dollars to Fire Department, Item 0.

SEC. 2. The sum of two hundred eighty-two thousand seven hundred fifty (\$282,750) dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and the City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the anticipated surplus in this year's budget to the Receipt Account.

SEC. 3. The estimated receipts from Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures is hereby increased by the sum of two hundred eighty-two thousand seven hundred fifty (\$282,750) dollars.

SEC. 4. All moneys hereby appropriated are to be expended by granting a three hundred twenty-five ~~thousand~~ (\$325,000) dollar increased cost of living bonus to the four hundred thirty (430) sworn police officers in the Police Department, including four (4) policewomen, but not including women crossing guards or civilian employees, and the four hundred forty (440) uniformed members of the Fire Department, not including recruits in training.

SEC. 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
