~~WHEREAS, the Members of the City Council, in view of the concern of the safety of the same residents, are of the opinion that permission to store Petroleum Products, should be regulated more stringently, therefore the necessity of the adoption of this, as an Emergency Ordinance,~~

2.2. SECTION 1. The Director of the Department of Building Inspection, or his Deputy, or Agents of the Department of Building
2.2. Inspection, shall issue no permit\$ to erect, alter, or use a
2.2. building or structure at ~~any~~ location, for the sale of Petroleum, Kerosene, Gasoline, Coal Oil and their Products, Compounds and Components, until permission to store the same Petroleum Products ~~have~~ ^{HAS} been granted by the City Council.
