KENNETH JOHN FILARSKI AIA

Founder and President of the firm of FILARSKI/architecture planning research located in Providence, Rhode Island. The firm, founded in 1978, is a multidisciplinary organization noted for its innovative design and planning work which develops out of sound technical, economical, and timely project approaches. Mr. Filarski is a national award winner from the Department of Housing and Urban Development for his affordable design and construction methods and techniques which result in lower housing costs while maintaining design quality and human values.

A former Senior Planner with the Department of Environmental Management's Division of Coastal Resources, he was responsible for the master plan at the Port of Galilee and for developing building guidelines in the coastal zone. He has directed major planning efforts in the Town of Charlestown, Rhode Island involving socio-economic impact studies for a nuclear power plant, re-use studies for a major naval air station, public education programs in the town schools, and a comprehensive town planning effort. He is nationally recognized for his work in affordable housing, learning environments and his work in education. Formerly a Teaching Fellow at Goddard College, Mr. Filarski was responsible for the design and construction of all the college's facilities in a unique program of having the college's students directly participating in the building construction.

Currently Mr. Filarski is the senior member of the Board of Directors of the American Institute of Architects. He is the only Rhode Island architect ever elected to the AIA Board. Twice elected President of the Rhode Island Chapter /AIA, an indication of the respect Mr. Filarski has among his professional peers is his recent nomination for the office of Vice-President of the American Institute of Architects, the youngest architect ever nominated for that position. He has been a national leader in developing design and practice methodologies, in public education, in the AIA's Regional and Urban Design Assistance Teams, in reinstating formal principles of ethical and professional practice, and in making the design process understandable to the general public. He is currently authoring a book on learning environments.

In the last regard Mr. Filarski has been working closely with the Public Broadcasting System to produce "America By Design", a five part television series to be aired in 1986, which will examine the impact and influence of design in the home, the workplace, the car, the park, and the street. Mr. Filarski is currently overseeing the \$30 million renovation of the AIA Headquarters Building in Washington, D.C., and the "Octagon", a National Landmark which was the former headquarters building of the AIA and James Madison's White House during the War of 1812. He is a graduate of the Catholic University of America in architecture, and holds a Master's Degree in Architecture and Environmental Design from Goddard College.






