

Dear Councilwoman:

This is to confirm my telephone request that the Finance Committee review the following resolution and consider having it directly introduced for passage at the next Council meeting, in order to expedite the process.

The city is required by the state to agree, by contract, to pay \$105,000 as our share of the \$2.7 million cost of relocating the fire alarm headquarters, which is part of the Capital Center Project. The \$105,000 is not part of the \$4.6 million Capital Center bond issue that has been approved.

I only recently learned from the R.I. Department of Transportation's legal counsel that we must sign the contract now, even though the \$105,000 will not be required by the state until next fiscal year.

I was also told the state will not proceed any further to develop plans until the contract is signed. This is why I am requesting quick consideration of the resolution. It also is apparent that \$105,000 is well worth spending in order to generate \$2.7 million in improvements to the fire alarm system.

The draft resolution is as follows:
