No. 307 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 791, SECTION 1 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1930, AS RE-ENACTED BY SECTION 4 OF CHAPTER 5 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1946.

Approved May 6, 1968

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 791, Section 1 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1930, as re-enacted by Section 4 of Chapter 5 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, is amended to read as follows:

"Sec.4. Prohibited Hours of Sales. No auctioneer shall hold any auction before the hour of 9:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m."

SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

The original petition as signed by the neighbors is enclosed.


