No. 396 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF
ANNUITIES TO WIDOWS OF POLICEMEN OR FIREMEN

Approved August 8, 1958

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Each unremarried widow of a policeman or fireman who was a member of the Police or Fire Department of the City of Providence prior to October 1, 1923, and whose death occurred, or hereafter may occur while in service, or after retirement on pension, shall receive from the City upon application duly made, an amount which, when added to all net income received by such unremarried widow from any source whatsoever, including any retirement payments or social security allowance, shall assure to such unremarried widow a sum not to exceed ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS per month and not to exceed a total of TWELVE HUNDRED (\$1,200.00) DOLLARS per year: but the annuities provided hereunder shall be considered as grants for additional support, and shall not be considered as vested rights in any annuitant.

Sec. 2. The Finance Committee of the City Council shall from time to time determine the amount of each such annuity, and the City Controller, under the advice and direction of the Finance Committee, shall administer the payment of such annuities through the City Treasurer. The Finance Committee shall establish such rules and regulations as it deems necessary and advisable for the guidance of the City Controller with respect to such annuities.

Sec. 3. Amounts payable under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance shall accrue and be payable only to an unremarried widow during her lifetime; shall not survive her death; shall not be assignable, transferable, or subject to attachment, nor shall such payments be retroactive for more than one month, and payments may be terminated at any time by vote of the Finance Committee after hearing for cause.

Sec. 4. Each person eligible for payments under the terms of this Ordinance shall file monthly with the City Controller on or before such date as designated by him an information return in such form and detail as he may require. No monthly benefits shall be paid until receipt of such return

Sec. 7. This Ordinance shall take effect as of October 1, 1958 and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

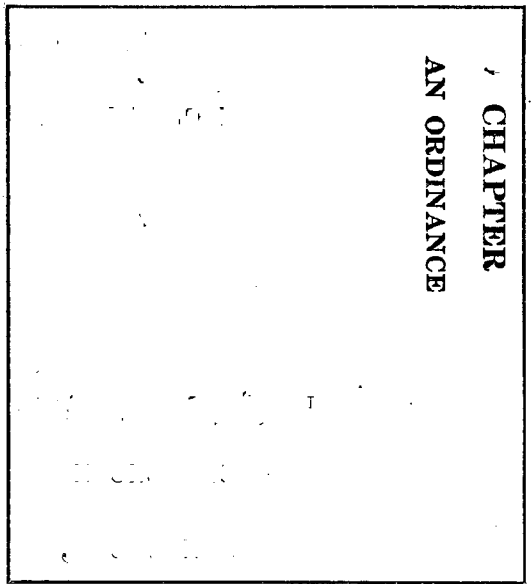

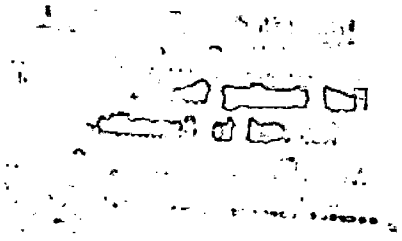

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DEPUTY HEALTH OFFICER and DEPUTY INSPECTOR of MILK

CLASS TITLE: Deputy Health Officer and Deputy Inspector of Milk

CLASS DEFINITION: Highly responsible technical work enforcing Health Ordinances and Laws, and Milk and Sanitation Ordinances and Laws.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Work involves responsibility for conducting and participating in the sanitary control of pasteurization plants and directing the activities of a milk laboratory with a staff of technicians, sample collectors and dairy inspector. The work further involves the supervision of the activities of the sanitarian aides of the health department engaged in inspection of food and beverage dispensing establishments and other sanitary problems and the requesting of warrants and assisting in the prosecution of violations of health ordinances. General supervision is received from the Supt. of Health but incumbent is responsible for technical phases of work. Work also involves the responsibility of supervising the operation of the Health Department during the absence or incapacity of the Supt. of Health and the performance of all those duties not by law expressly requiring the services of a doctor of medicine. He shall have the authority during such times to hold hearings, suspend or revoke licenses under the authority by law or ordinance delegated to the Supt. of Health.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: Checking on the accuracy of laboratory tests made by the department. Supervision of the records of inspection made by milk department personnel and sanitarian aides. Issuing warning notices to violators of health ordinances and collecting evidence for hearing and prosecutions. Supervision of rodent control activities. Preparation of quarterly reports of the department of milk inspection. Preparation of lists of applicants for licenses to be granted by the City Council.

DESIRABLE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Knowledge of the construction and operation of pasteurization plants, the principles of sanitary control of milk and food and beverages, and the chemistry and bacteriology involved in the control of purity and wholesomeness of milk, beverages and food stuffs. Also knowledge of general sanitation, the controlling laws and ordinances and ability to enforce these with firmness and tact.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Graduation from a recognized college or university with major courses in chemistry, bacteriology and sanitation, and preferably experience in public health laboratory work and general familiarity with public health principles and practices.

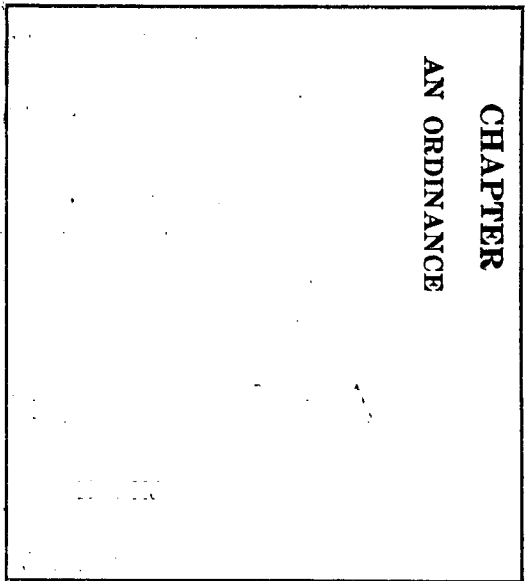

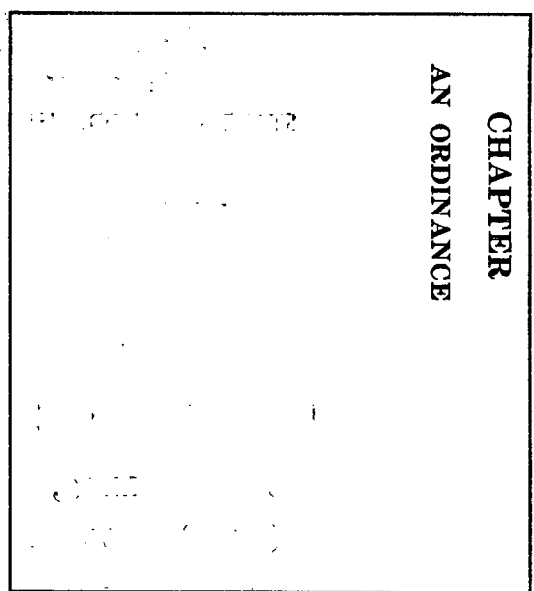
