

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 238

Approved April 3, 1964

WHEREAS, the retention, growth, and expansion of industry is vital to the economic well-being of the City, and

WHEREAS, industrialists and bankers, because of their ability, experience and associations are in a position to render great service to our Community; and

WHEREAS, the interest of the workingman in having a sound, economic and social base in the City is beyond dispute and the assistance of labor in obtaining that end is indispensable; and

WHEREAS, this City Council feels that industry, banks, labor and Government must work together for the common good of the entire community;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT

1. The Mayor be requested to appoint an Industrial Advisory Council of such size as he shall deem advisable composed of representatives of industry, the banks, industrial workers and including a member of the majority party and of the minority party in the City Council and upon which the Urban Renewal Co-ordinator, the Director of the City Plan Commission and the Director of the Redevelopment Agency shall be ex-officio members, and including such other persons as the Mayor shall deem advisable.

2. Said Council shall advise the Mayor

- A. Upon matters which affect the industrial base of the City and which are within the competence of the City Government,
- B. How to retain present industry and to assist in its growth and expansion,
- C. How to attract new industry.

3. Said Council shall also endeavor to procure the cooperation of the groups which they represent with other civic-minded citizens to make this City a better place in which to engage in business, work, live and play.

4. The Mayor shall make available to said Council meeting

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ISSUE BONDS IN THE SUM OF ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$1,500,000) DOLLARS FOR SCHOOL REDEMPTION AND/OR CONSTRUCTION.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. The city of Providence is hereby authorized and empowered, in addition to and not in substitution for authority previously granted, to issue, in addition to the bonds heretofore issued and now outstanding, under its corporate name and seal, serial bonds in any form which the city council of said city has heretofore approved or may approve, in an amount not exceeding one million five hundred thousand (\$1,500,000) dollars. Said bonds shall be of any denomination not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars each, the principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America, which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts, and the debts incurred by said bonds shall be obligatory on said city in the same manner and to the same extent as other debts lawfully contracted by said city. The dates of maturity of said bonds shall, in no case, be more than twenty-five (25) years after date of issue; provided, however, that the first installment of the principal of the bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall mature on such date as said city council shall determine, but not later than five (5) years after the date of issuance.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the city treasurer, and countersigned by the mayor of the city of Providence and shall be issued

and sold at such times and in such amount as the city council of said city shall determine. The premiums, if any, arising from the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the cost of preparing, issuing and marketing the bonds, and any balance of such premiums shall be applied to the payment of the principal of said bonds in the order of their maturity. The proceeds arising from the sale of the bonds authorized by this act shall be delivered to the City Treasurer, and such proceeds, except as hereinbefore provided in respect to the premiums arising from the sale thereof, shall be expended for the repair, modernization, construction and reconstruction, furnishing and equipping of school buildings in the City of Providence, including the acquisition of any necessary land therefor, by purchase or condemnation. No purchaser of any of said bonds, however, shall be in any way responsible for the proper application of the proceeds derived from the sale thereof. The countersignature of the mayor may be by facsimile signature.

SEC. 3. The city of Providence shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the interest upon the bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this act, and also to pay the principal of the bonds maturing in any such year, until said bonds are paid in full. All obligations of said city which are incurred under authority of this act shall be excepted from the operation of section 45-12-2 of the general laws of 1956.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage and shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Providence at the next general or special election in said city, and said bonds shall not be issued unless a majority of the voters of said city voting thereon shall approve this legislative action.
