

In September of 1965, both Maria and her husband Walter were blessed with the birth of their first child and she remained there until March of 1973 when she took another maternity leave for the birth of her second son, and

WHEREAS, With two young children to care for, Maria returned to Mount Pleasant High School in September of that year and was named Head of the English Department. With an abundance of dedication, energy and enthusiasm, Maria Wilk not only raised her own family, but became the mentor to hundreds of young people at Mount Pleasant who became accustomed to her personal attention and guidance, and

WHEREAS, In May of 1982, she was named Acting Assistant Principal at Hope High School, and in September of that same year, she was named Acting Assistant Principal at Mount Pleasant High School. In September of 1983, Maria was named Assistant Principal at Mount Pleasant, and on January 15, 1991 Maria Wilk was named Principal of Mount Pleasant High School, and

RESOLVED, That the Members of the City Council hereby extend their sincere best wishes to Joseph Richardson for a complete and speedy recovery from his recent operation.


