Section 1. Section 17-33 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled: "Standard of Conduct of Employees" is hereby amended to read as follows:

(11) No person, at municipal expense, shall copy, print, mail, distribute or otherwise disseminate or cause the copying, printing, mailing, distributing, or disseminating in a number greater than two hundred (200) of any document unless the words "*Paid for by the Taxpayers of the City of Providence*" appears on each page of the document.

Provided, however, this provision shall not apply to any person who shall copy, print, mail, distribute or otherwise disseminate any correspondence from any officer, employee or agent of any governmental body.

Section 2, This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance in Amendment of And in Addition to Chapter 17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence by Adding Section 17-34, entitled: "Standard Conduct of Elected Officials".

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Upon the award of any contract to any person, firm, partnership or other business entity wherein goods or services are provided to the City at a cost of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or more, said person, firm, partnership or other business entity shall report all contributions of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more made to any municipal elected official or to any individual declared as a candidate for any municipal elective office. The same shall be contained in an affidavit to be filed with the Department of Administration of the City.

Section 2. The reporting requirement contained herein shall be contained in any request for proposal for any contract required by the City.

Section 3. The Director of Administration shall provide that all affidavits filed hereunder be opened to the public.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

4. The Petitioner shall grant to the appropriate public utility and/or governmental agency, by pertinent document, any easements, licenses, or the like, so as to maintain public services.

5. A certified copy of the within Resolution shall be recorded in the Office of Land Evidence of the City of Providence.

6. Any rights or obligations granted hereunder shall be deemed to run with the land and shall operate against any and all successors in interest and/or in title.

7. Any rights or obligations granted hereunder shall remain in full force and effect for so long as the encroachment permitted hereby does cease to be utilized for the purposes specified earlier.

8. Such other reasonable conditions as the Mayor and/or the Department of Law may impose hereunder.
