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IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 16-7-20 OF THE GENERAL LAWS IN
CHAPTER 7-20, ENTITLED "FOUNDATION LEVEL SCHOOL SUPPORT".

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 16-7-20 of the General Laws in Chapter 7-20, entitled "Foundation Level School Support" is hereby amended to read as follows:

16-7-20. ~~The state's share--how determined.--~~For each community the state's share shall be that percentage of one hundred percent (100%) resulting from subtracting the yield of the standard local tax rate applied to equalized weighted assessed valuation divided by the reference year cost of the basic program; provided, however, that in no case shall the state's share be less than thirty-five percent (35%). This percentage shall be applied to (a) the cost of the basic program and (b) all expenditures approved by the state board of education in excess of the basic program; provided, however, that expenditures from federal monies in lieu of taxes shall not be counted and, provided further, that for the first two (2) years of operation, the state's share to each community shall be at least ten percent (10%) greater than the total of all state aids for day school operation received in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960; provided further, however, in the case of regional school districts, the state's share shall be increased by two percent (2%) for each grade so consolidated for the first two (2) years of operation, diminishing thereafter by one-fourth of one percent (.25) per grade per year but in no event shall such increased percentage be less than four percent (4%).

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 3715 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS, 1956 ENTITLED "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ENACT ORDINANCES RELATING TO MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR DWELLINGS, AND THE REPAIR, CLOSING, VACATION AND DEMOLITION OF DWELLINGS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 8 of Chapter 3715 of the Public Laws, 1956, entitled "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Enact Ordinances Relating to Minimum Standards for Dwellings, and the Repair, Closing, Vacation and Demolition of Dwellings Unfit for Human Habitation", is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sub-section:

"(h) Provisions that any notices and orders may be recorded in the same manner as the recording of 'lis pendens' notices."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Approved December 6, 1963

WHEREAS, under Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, and the Housing Act of 1954, the Housing and Home Finance Administrator is authorized to extend financial assistance to localities in the elimination and prevention of the spread of their slums and urban blight through the planning and undertaking of urban renewal projects; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the public interest that the Providence Redevelopment Agency prepare surveys and plans, presently estimated to cost approximately Seven Hundred Fifty Four Thousand Eight Hundred Thirteen (\$754,813) Dollars, in order to undertake and carry out an urban renewal project of the character contemplated by Section 110(c) of said Title I in that certain area proposed as an urban renewal area, situated in the City of Providence, County of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, and described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of Eddy and Fulton Streets and running north along Eddy Street to the north side of West Exchange Street, westerly along West Exchange Street, Route I-95 Interchange condemnation line, Lot 62, Assessor's Plat 26 to Harris Avenue; then running easterly along Harris Avenue, Kinsley Street across the Woonasquatucket River to Promenade Street, Park Street, Brownell Street, Francis Street, Gaspee Street to Smith Street; then along Canal Street across Memorial Square along Exchange Place to the point of origin.

WHEREAS, the above-cited Federal law requires as a condition to the execution of a contract for loan and capital grant for an urban renewal project that the locality present to the Housing and Home Finance Administrator a Workable Program, as set forth in Section 110(c) of said Title I, for utilizing appropriate public and private resources to eliminate and prevent the development or spread of slums and urban blight, to encourage needed urban rehabilitation, to provide for the redevelopment of blighted, deteriorated or slum areas, or to undertake such other feasible community activities as may be suitably employed to achieve the objectives of such a program; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that contracts for loans and capital grants for urban renewal projects will require, among other things, (1) the approval of an Urban Renewal Plan by the governing body of the locality in which the subject project is situated; (2) the provision of local grants-in-aid which may consist of donations of cash, land, demolition or removal work, and the installation, construction or reconstruction of streets, utilities, parks, playgrounds or other improvements or the provision of other public buildings or facilities; and (3) the carrying out of a feasible method for the relocation of families displaced from the urban renewal area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the CITY COUNCIL of the CITY OF PROVIDENCE as follows:

Section 1. That the proposed urban renewal area described above is a slum blighted, deteriorated or deteriorating area appropriate for an urban renewal project and that the undertaking by the Providence Redevelopment Agency of surveys and plans for an urban renewal project of the character contemplated by Section 110(c) of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended and supplemented in the proposed urban renewal area described above, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the financial assistance provided under said Title I to assist urban renewal projects is needed and that the Housing and Home Finance Administrator is hereby requested to reserve for an urban renewal project in the proposed urban renewal area described above Federal capital grant funds in an amount sufficient to enable the Providence Redevelopment Agency to finance the undertaking of the project.

Section 3. That it is cognizant of the conditions that are imposed in the undertaking and carrying out of urban renewal projects with Federal financial assistance under Title I, including the requirements of said Title I respecting the Workable Program mentioned above, and that it is the sense of this body (a) that a feasible method for the relocation of families displaced from the urban renewal area, in conformity with said Title I, can be prepared, and (b) that local grants-in-aid, consisting of donations of cash, land, demolition or removal work, and the installation, construction or reconstruction of streets, utilities, parks, playgrounds or other improvements or the provision of other public buildings or facilities, necessary for carrying out in the urban renewal area the urban renewal objectives of said Title I in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan, can and will be provided in an amount which will not be less than one-third of the net project cost and which, together with the Federal capital grant, will be generally equal to the difference between gross project costs and the proceeds or value of project land sold, leased or retained for use in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan.

Section 4. That the filing of an application by the Providence Redevelopment Agency for an advance of funds from the United States of America to enable it to defray the cost of the surveys and plans for an urban renewal project in the urban renewal area described above is hereby approved.


Dear Mr. Vespia:

The Providence Redevelopment Agency respectfully requests that the attached resolution be placed on the docket for the November 21, 1963 meeting of the City Council for its consideration. The substance of the resolution is to authorize the filing of an Amendatory Survey & Planning Application for the Railroad Relocation Project with the Housing and Home Finance Agency in the total amount of \$754,813.

The filing of said application will provide the necessary financial assistance to defray the costs of preparing surveys and plans, which are now proposed to extend the project boundaries to include additional areas west of the proposed I-95 Interchange and the areas north of Hayes Street to Brownell Street. The expansion of the project area will necessitate the extension of the present planning period an additional twelve months, and consequently, this will require the amount of the Federal planning advance to be increased by an additional \$320,000.

We are hopeful that this resolution will receive favorable Council action. In that event, we will require eight (8) certified copies of said resolution for submission with other documentation to the Housing and Home Finance Agency.
