

Dear Mr. Vespia:

Thank you for forwarding a copy of the Resolution adopted by the Providence City Council urging the immediate construction of a nuclear power plant in Rhode Island.

I appreciate very much having the views of the Council on this vital concern and recognize the substantial benefits for our region from the construction of a new electric generating facility. I can assure you that I will keep the position of the Council very much in mind, weighing carefully Rhode Island's future energy requirements along with the potential of alternative sources in meeting this demand.

With regard to nuclear safety, I believe you will be pleased to know that the Senate will shortly consider a bill, S. 2744, the Energy Reorganization Act, to strengthen present safeguards for nuclear facilities. That measure will also establish a Bureau of Nuclear Materials Safety to deal specifically with threats, accidents and sabotage to nuclear materials. In addition, it is my understanding that the Atomic Energy Commission is presently preparing an impact statement on appropriate methods of radioactive waste disposal, considering such possibilities as the use of salt domes, bedded salt mines or mausoleums.

Thank you again for the views of the Council.
