WHEREAS, The United States Congress has declared that language minorities have been effectively excluded from participating in the electoral process, and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress definition of language minorities includes groups with a Spanish heritage, and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress has declared that, in order to enforce the guarantees of the fourteenth and fifteenth amendments to the U S Constitution remedial devices are essential, and


WHEREAS, The United States Congress has mandated a prohibition of voting materials printed only in the English language effective August 6, 2007, and

WHEREAS, The number of individuals living in the City of Providence with a Spanish heritage is significant and deserving of remedial devices called Voter Registration Forms written in Spanish to facilitate increased participation into the political and electoral process.





