WHEREAS, the Westminster Mall has had controversy concerning its effect on business in Downtown Providence, and

WHEREAS, during sunny good weather it is well used and is working out effectively, but during cold and inclement weather it has discouraged shoppers from coming into downtown Providence and getting dropped off near the stores, banks and professional offices of their choice, and

WHEREAS, it is vitally important for downtown Providence to be revitalized and be returned to the position of a shopping center in the leading commercial department of the State of Rhode Island and Southern New England.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Traffic Engineer, The Planning and Urban Renewal Committee, The Chamber of Commerce and other interested persons study the feasibility and consider and recommend and be heard as well as adjoining business as to whether or not the downtown Mall should be opened up for passenger busing traffic during inclement and unseasonably cold weather and during winter months.
