




RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- PUBLIC UTILITIES

Introduced By: Senators Goodwin, Ciccone, and Ruggerio

Date Introduced: February 11, 2004

Referred To: Senate Judiciary

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11-35 of the General Laws entitled "Public Utilities" is hereby
2 amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 **11-35-29. Interference with fire hydrants.** – Every person who willfully or fraudulently
4 damages or knowingly allows to be damaged any fire hydrant connected with or belonging to the
5 waterworks of the City of Providence Water Supply Board or willfully tampers or meddles with
6 any other of the appliances or appurtenances connected with or belonging to the City of
7 Providence Water Supply Board in a manner that causes loss or damage shall be deemed guilty of
8 a felony and shall be imprisoned for not more than two (2) years or be fined not more than five
9 thousand dollars (\$5,000).
- 10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

RESOLUTION OF THE PROVIDENCE WATER SUPPLY BOARD


WHEREAS, the City of Providence Water Supply Board is an agency of the City of Providence, Rhode Island and owns and operates a water supply system; and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
