## CHAPTER 1876

No. 787 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 2, SECTION 165.1, OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES, PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN HOLIDAYS AND COMPENSATION FOR WORKING ON SAID HOLIDAYS.

Approved December 18, 1964

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Section 165.1 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 165.1 Holidays and pay for working thereon


All permanent employees of the City of Providence paid on an hourly basis shall be entitled to and shall receive pay as established by ordinance for the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, V-J Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Election Day, Armistice Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day; provided that such holiday occurs on a day when such employee normally renders services, and further provided, that such employees shall receive such pay only when they have worked on the last working day before each holiday and have worked on the next working day following each holiday. All work performed on <sup>SUCH</sup> a holiday shall be paid at the rate of 150% of the employee's regular hourly rate pay for the actual time worked in addition to the regular pay allowed for the holiday, but the period of such work shall not be credited as part of his work week in computing overtime pay as provided in Section 162.4 of this Chapter. Whenever <sup>SUCH</sup> a holiday occurs on a day when a permanent hourly paid employee normally renders services, the holiday shall be considered as part of his work week for the purposes of computing overtime. v.d.

The provisions of this section shall not deprive any department head of the right to require city employees to work on any legal holiday when such work in the opinion of said department head is necessary to the general welfare and safety. v.d.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

This Supplemental Cooperation Agreement entered into this 22nd day of December, 1964, by and between the PROVIDENCE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, a public body, corporate and politic, in the State of Rhode Island (hereinafter called the "Agency") and the CITY OF PROVIDENCE, a municipal corporation in the County of Providence, State of Rhode Island (hereinafter called the "City").

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Agency has processed a redevelopment plan for the redevelopment of the project area known as the "Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2;" and

WHEREAS, said plan has been approved and adopted by ordinance Chapter 1419, No. 421, dated August 11, 1961 of the City Council of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Providence by Resolution No. 426 approved August 11, 1961, authorized the Mayor to execute a Cooperation Agreement between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency providing for cooperation between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency with respect to the redevelopment plan for the Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2; and

WHEREAS, said Cooperation Agreement between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency was signed on August 17, 1961, and

WHEREAS modifications to the Redevelopment Plan for the Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2 was approved and adopted by ordinance, Chapter 1554, No. 458, dated August 8, 1963, of the City Council of the City of Providence, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Providence by Resolution No. 438, approved July 11, 1963, authorized the Mayor to execute a Supplemental Cooperation Agreement between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency providing for cooperation between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency with respect to the Modified Redevelopment Plan for the Central-Classical Project, No. R. I. R-2; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has processed additional modifications to the redevelopment of the Project area known as the "Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2"; and

WHEREAS such modifications to the Redevelopment Plan have been approved and adopted by ordinance, Chapter 1670, No. 781, dated December 17, 1964, of the City Council of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Agency desire to modify said Cooperation Agreement and Supplemental Cooperation Agreement as hereinbefore set forth in certain respects to properly effectuate and carry out the additional modifications to the Redevelopment Plan for Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2 as approved by the City Council of the City of Providence.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto on their own behalf and on behalf of the government as follows:

1. At the end of Paragraph 3A1 insert the following:

"When the Agency shall require possession thereof and title thereto in execution of the Redevelopment Project, the City will convey to the Agency all its right, title and interest in those certain buildings located on Lot 17 on Assessor's Plat 24 and on Lots 250, 259, and 269 on Assessor's Plat 29 as recorded in the office of the Tax Assessor of the City of Providence, which said buildings are further identified as Classical High School, Gymnasium, Annex A, and the Heating Plant, respectively, and the City shall receive credit on its obligations hereunder for the full and fair market value of its interest therein, including any and all severance damage in connection with the conveyance of said buildings to the Agency, in the amount of \$999,334.00, for a total non-cash grant in the amount of \$1,145,834.00."

2. The Cooperation Agreement approved by the City Council of the City of Providence on August 11, 1961 and entered into on the 17th. day of August, 1961 with amendments thereto, is hereby ratified and confirmed in all other respects.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the City and the Agency have caused this Supplemental Cooperation Agreement to be duly executed in triplicate as of the day and year first above written.

Gentlemen:

On October 29, 1964 the State Department of Public Works opened for traffic service the portion of Interstate Route 95 from West Exchange Street to Orms Street. Northbound traffic can exit from this portion of the freeway onto Park Street or on Orms Street. The only entrance to this portion of the freeway is from the lower end of Chalkstone Avenue serving southbound traffic.


Immediately upon the opening of this portion of the freeway, many motorists changed their normal travel patterns to take advantage of this new highway, and as a result a considerable amount of congestion and increased traffic volume has been observed on Orms Street, Douglas Avenue, Whipple Street, Admiral Street, and Charles Street. In order to find some way to relieve some of these local streets, it was suggested to the State Department of Public Works that a temporary roadway be built across railroad property to connect the northern end of Route 95 in the vicinity of Chalkstone Avenue to the southern end of Oriental Street at Oregon Street, thereby creating a reasonably direct connection between I-95 and the present southern terminus of Louisquisset Pike at Admiral Street.

In order to make such a connection operate effectively, it is necessary to establish Oriental Street, between Oregon Street and Admiral Street, as a one-way street in a northerly direction. It is also necessary to establish Whipple Street as a one-way street in a southerly direction from Admiral Street to Oregon Street; and to establish Oregon Street as a one-way street in an easterly direction from Whipple Street to Oriental Street.

This temporary bypass pattern is being constructed by the State Department of Public Works to serve not only as a traffic relief measure at the present time, but also as a temporary bypass pattern for the duration of the construction period for the permanent I-95 Louisquisset Pike connection. At this time it is not known how long this construction period will be, but it is anticipated that it will require not less than two years, and it may require three or four years before this permanent construction will be completed.

It is strongly recommended that the three one-way streets itemized above be established to facilitate this traffic movement.




