Resolved,

That, whereas Chapter 1206--Public Laws 761 of the laws of the Eighty-Third Congress, approved September 1, 1954 and cited as "The Social Security Amendments of 1954" amends the Social Security Act by providing in part that an agreement with a State may be made applicable to service performed by employees in positions covered by a retirement system if the Governor of the State certifies to the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare that certain conditions have been met, and

WHEREAS, one of such conditions is that a referendum be held under the supervision of the Governor or an agency or an individual designated by him at which time eligible employees may vote on the question of whether service in positions covered by such retirement system should be excluded from or included under an agreement under Section 218 of the Social Security Act, and

WHEREAS, it seems desirable that the eligible employees of the City of Providence be given the opportunity to make such determination at a referendum duly held in accordance with the Social Security Act as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That Governor Dennis J. Roberts be and he hereby is respectfully requested to conduct such referendum under his direct supervision or that of an agency or individual designated by him and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in said Chapter 1206--Public Laws 761.
