ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The Following Ordinances were in City Council February 18, 1982, Read and Passed the First Time and are Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 1419 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, Approved August 11, 1961, and Entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Central-Classical Project No. R.I. R-2" for the Revision of Parcel Controls in the R-4 Multiple Residence Zone.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

1. That Chapter 1419 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved August 11, 1961 and entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Central-Classical Project No. R.I. R-2" as amended by Chapter 1973-25 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved June 11, 1973,

be and the same is hereby further amended as follows:-

A. Paragraphs (b), (e), (f) and (j) Parcel controls for the R-4 Multiple Residence Zone under Section C.2. "Land Use Provisions and Building Requirements" as contained in and set forth in Pages 6 and 7 of that certain booklet entitled, "Official Redevelopment Plan for Central-Classical Project No. R.I. R-2", which is a part of the aforementioned Ordinance, be and the same is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefore:

(b) Maximum Dwelling Density-Shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence.

(e) Minimum Building Setback-Shall be

governed by the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of City of Providence.

(f) Maximum Building Height-Shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence.

(j) Minimum Off-Street Parking Space-Shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence.

2. That said Chapter 1419 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence as adopted and as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby ratified and affirmed in all other respects.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy thereof to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 544 of 1951 by Changing from an R-1 One Family Zone to an R-2 Two Family Zone, Lot 243, as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 86, said lot being located along Cole Avenue.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. The Zoning Map accompanying and made a part of Chapter 544 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved September 21, 1951, as heretofore amended, and entitled, "An Ordinance Zoning the City of Providence and Establishing Use, Height and Area Regulations", as amended, is hereby further amended by changing from an R-1 One Family Zone to and R-2 Two Family Zone, Lot 243, as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 86; said lot being located along Cole Avenue, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the northeasterly intersection of

Luzon Avenue and Cole Avenue thence northerly along the westerly line of Cole Avenue to the southwesterly intersection of Laurel Avenue and Cole Avenue; thence westerly along the southerly line of Laurel Avenue to the northeasterly corner of Lot 546 on City of Providence Assessor's Plat 86, thence southerly bounded westerly by Lots 546 and 250 to the northerly street line of Luzon Avenue, thence easterly along the northerly street line of Luzon Avenue to the northeasterly intersection of Laurel Avenue and Cole Avenue, said point being point and place of beginning.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.

An Ordinance Amending the Appropriation Ordinance Chapter 1981-39 Effective July 20, 1981 by Transferring the Sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) from Unemployment Account to the City Council for the Committee on Ward Boundaries.

Be It Ordained By The City of Providence:

Section 1. Chapter 1981-39, of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, effective July 20, 1981, entitled: An Ordinance Making an Appropriation of One Hundred Forty-Nine Million, Eight Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand, One Hundred Twenty-Two Dollars and Nine Cents (\$149,862,122.09), as amended, is hereby further amended by transferring the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) from Unemployment Account to the City Council for the Committee on Ward Boundaries.

An Ordinance Apportioning the Fifteen Wards in the City of Providence in Accordance with Section 204 of the Providence Home Rule Charter of 1980 Approved by the Electors of the City of Providence at the General Election held November 4, 1980, as Amended.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. The City of Providence is hereby apportioned into fifteen wards in accordance with Section 204 of the Providence Home Rule Charter of 1980, as approved by the Electors of the City of Providence at the General Election held November 4, 1980 and validated by the General Assembly on May 7, 1981.

The fifteen wards are bounded and described as follows:

FIRST WARD

The First Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Interstate Route 95 and Washington Street; thence northeasterly along Washington Street to South Water Street; thence southeasterly along South Water Street to Hutchinson Street; thence easterly along Hutchinson Street to South Main Street; thence crossing South Main Street to Hopkins Street; thence easterly along Hopkins Street to Benefit Street; thence southeasterly along Benefit Street to George Street; thence easterly along George Street to Brown Street; thence southerly along Brown Street to Charlesfield Street; thence easterly along Charlesfield Street to Thayer Street; thence northerly along Thayer Street to Waterman Street; thence easterly along Waterman Street to Governor Street; thence northerly along Governor Street to Medway Street; thence easterly along Medway

Street and a line in extension of Medway Street to the Providence, East Providence Boundary Line; thence southwesterly along the Providence-East Providence Boundary Line, crossing Interstate Route 195 and continuing southwesterly, southerly, southwesterly and southerly to a point in the easterly extension of Oxford Street; thence westerly along the easterly extension of Oxford Street to a point on the center line of the Providence River; thence northwesterly along said center line of the Providence River to a point in the easterly extension of Elm Street; thence westerly along the easterly extension of Elm Street to Elm Street; thence westerly along Elm Street and a line of extension of Elm Street to the Center Line of Interstate Route 95; thence northwesterly along Interstate Route 95 to its intersection with Washington Street and the point and place of beginning.

SECOND WARD

The Second Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Waterman Street and Thayer Street; thence easterly along Waterman Street to Governor Street; thence northerly along Governor Street to Medway Street; thence easterly along Medway Street and a line in extension of Medway Street to the Providence, East Providence Boundary Line; thence northeasterly, northerly and northwesterly along the Providence, East Providence Boundary Line to the intersection of Providence-Pawtucket and East Providence Boundary Lines; thence easterly, northerly and easterly along the Providence-Pawtucket Boundary Line to its point of intersection with Hope Street; thence southerly along Hope Street to Blackstone Boulevard; thence southeasterly along Blackstone Boulevard to Lorimer Avenue; thence southwesterly along Lorimer Avenue to Rochambeau Avenue; thence easterly along Rochambeau Avenue to Elmgrove Avenue; thence southwesterly along Elmgrove Avenue to Vassar Street; thence easterly along Vassar Street to Morris Avenue; thence southwesterly along Morris Avenue to Doyle Avenue; thence westerly along Doyle Avenue to Hope

Street; thence southerly along Hope Street to Barnes Street; thence westerly along Barnes Street to Jenckes Street; thence westerly along Jenckes Street to Pratt Street; thence southerly along Pratt Street to Wheaton Street; thence southeasterly along Wheaton Street to South Court Street; thence southeasterly along South Court Street to Meeting Street; thence easterly along Meeting Street to Prospect Street; thence southerly along Prospect Street to Angell Street; thence easterly along Angell Street to Thayer Street; thence southerly along Thayer Street to Waterman Street and the point and place of beginning.

THIRD WARD

The Third Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all the part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Pratt Street and Jenckes Street; thence westerly along Jenckes Street to Benefit Street; thence northerly along Benefit Street to Captain Carlton Davis Memorial Boulevard; thence northerly along Captain Carlton Davis Memorial Boulevard to North Main Street; thence northeasterly along North Main Street to the Providence-Pawtucket Boundary Line; thence easterly along the Providence-Pawtucket Boundary line to its point of intersection with Hope Street; thence southerly along Hope Street to Blackstone Boulevard; thence southeasterly along Blackstone Boulevard to Lorimer Avenue, thence southwesterly along Lorimer Avenue to Rochambeau Avenue; thence easterly along Rochambeau Avenue to Elmgrove Avenue; thence southwesterly along Elmgrove Avenue to Vassar Street; thence westerly along Vassar Street to Morris Avenue; thence southwesterly along Morris Avenue to Doyle Avenue; thence westerly along Doyle Avenue to Hope Street; thence southerly along Hope Street to Barnes Street; thence westerly along Barnes Street to Jenckes Street; thence westerly along Jenckes Street to Pratt Street and the point and place of beginning.

FOURTH WARD

The Fourth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of North Main Street and the Providence-Pawtucket Boundary Line; thence in a westerly, north-westerly direction to the Providence, North Providence Boundary Line; thence in a westerly direction along the Providence, North Providence Boundary line to Woodward Road; thence in a southwesterly direction along the Providence, North Providence Boundary Line to its intersection with Douglas Avenue; southeasterly along Douglas Avenue to Branch Avenue; thence in an easterly direction along Branch Avenue to the center line of Rhode Island Route 146; thence in a southerly direction along Rhode Island Route 146 to its intersection with Hawkins Street; thence in a southwesterly direction along Hawkins Street to Cromwell Street; thence in a southerly direction along Cromwell Street to Cheshire Street; thence in a southwesterly direction along Cheshire Street and an extension of Cheshire Street to Admiral Street; thence westerly along Admiral Street to Huxley Avenue; thence southerly along Huxley Avenue to Eaton Street; thence easterly along Eaton Street to Douglas Avenue; thence southeasterly along Douglas Avenue to Fillmore Street; thence northeasterly along Fillmore Street to Admiral Street; thence southeasterly along Admiral Street to the center line of the Penn Central Railroad; thence southeasterly along the center line of the Penn Central Railroad to its intersection with Orms Street; thence easterly along Orms Street to Charles Street; thence northerly along Charles Street to Stevens Street; thence easterly along Stevens Street to an extension of Stevens Street to Captain Carlton Davis Memorial Boulevard; thence northerly along Captain Carlton Davis Memorial Boulevard to North Main Street; thence northerly along North Main Street to the Providence-Pawtucket Boundary Line and the point and place of beginning.

FIFTH WARD

The Fifth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Providence-North Providence Boundary Line and Admiral Street; thence southeasterly along Admiral Street to Sharon Street; thence southerly along Sharon Street to Walton Street; thence westerly along Walton Street to Enfield Avenue; thence southerly along Enfield Avenue to Smith Street; thence southeasterly along Smith Street to Oakland Avenue; thence southerly along Oakland Avenue to Galileo Street, to Marconi Street to Chalkstone Avenue; thence westerly along Chalkstone Avenue to Oakwood Avenue; thence a northerly extension of Oakwood Avenue to College Road; thence westerly, southerly and westerly along College Road to the Providence-North Providence Boundary Line; thence north-easterly along the Providence-North Providence Boundary Line to its intersection with Admiral Street and point and place of beginning.

SIXTH WARD

The Sixth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Academy Avenue and Chalkstone Avenue; thence westerly along Chalkstone Avenue to Galileo Street, to Marconi Street, to Oakwood Avenue; thence northerly along a northerly extension of Oakwood Avenue to College Road; thence westerly, southerly and westerly along College Road to the Providence-North Providence Boundary Line; thence southerly along the Providence-North Providence Boundary Line to the Providence-Johnston Boundary Line and the center line of the Woonasquatucket River; thence southerly along the center line of the Woonasquatucket River and the Providence-Johnston Boundary Line to the Center Line of Rhode Island Route 6 to a southerly extension of Bosworth Street; thence northeasterly along the southerly extension of Bosworth Street and Bosworth Street to Manton Avenue; thence southeasterly along Manton Avenue to Pope

Street; thence northeasterly along Pope Street to Kossuth Street; thence easterly along Kossuth Street to Hyat Street; thence northerly along Hyat Street to Amherst Street; thence easterly along Amherst Street to Joslin Street; thence northerly along Joslin Street to Atwells Avenue; thence easterly along Atwells Avenue to Academy Avenue; thence northerly along Academy Avenue to Maplehurst Avenue; thence easterly along Maplehurst Avenue to Huron Street; thence northerly along Huron Street to Regent Avenue; thence westerly along Regent Avenue to Academy Avenue; thence northerly along Academy Avenue to Chalkstone Avenue and the point and place of beginning.

SEVENTH WARD

The Seventh Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Providence-Johnston Boundary Line and the center line of the Woonasquatucket River; thence southerly along the center line of the Woonasquatucket River to the center line of Rhode Island Route 6; thence southeasterly along Rhode Island Route 6 to its intersection with Hartford Avenue; thence westerly along Hartford Avenue to Bodell Avenue; thence southeasterly along Bodell Avenue to Heath Street; thence southerly along Heath Street to Eastwood Street; thence westerly along Eastwood Street to Webster Avenue; thence southerly along Webster Avenue to Pocasset Avenue; thence westerly along Pocasset Avenue to Laurel Hill Avenue; thence southerly along Laurel Hill Avenue to Terrace Avenue; thence southeasterly along Terrace Avenue to the Providence-Cranston Boundary Line; thence westerly along the Providence-Cranston Boundary Line to the Providence-Johnston Boundary Line; thence westerly, northerly and easterly along the Providence-Johnston Boundary Line to the center line of the Woonasquatucket River and the point and place of beginning.

EIGHTH WARD

COUNCILMAN O'CONNOR calls for a Point of Order and states that when an Amendment is submitted for any Ward boundaries which effects other wards, the proposer of the amendment should also submit the amendment to the Ward that is being effected and when the Seventh Ward is amended, the Fifteenth Ward will also be effected by any change in the Seventh Ward; therefore, the Fifteenth Ward must also be amended and that has not been done.

COUNCILMAN ALMAGNO moves that the Ordinance be amended to the Fifteenth Ward as follows:

And I further amend the ordinance as follows: "the westerly boundary of Ward 15 shall follow the easterly boundary of Ward 7 as amended."

This motion is seconded by **COUNCILMAN MANSOLILLO**.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT LYNCH states the amendment is improperly presented.

COUNCILMAN PEARLMAN states that it is his understanding that Councilman Almagno has made a motion to amend the Ward Lines to Ward 7, that has been duly seconded and the President has ruled the motion Out of Order.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT LYNCH states that the Council President rules the Motion to Amend as presented by Councilman Almagno is Out of Order as it does not delineate the lines as they refer to the proposed Ward 15, therefore, he rules the Amendment to be Out of Order.

COUNCILMAN PEARLMAN states that Councilman Almagno has further Amended the duly Proposed Amendment.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT LYNCH states that the Supplementary Amendment that Councilman Almagno has offered to the Council does not comply with the requirements in that it does not outline the change of boundaries in Ward Fifteen.

COUNCILMAN PEARLMAN Moves to Appeal the Ruling of the President.

This motion is seconded by **COUNCILMAN FARMER**.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT LYNCH states that the Ruling of the Chair is that Councilman Almagno's motion was in error

in that although properly proposed, the Amendment in regards to Ward Seven does not properly outline the Amendment as it concerns the proposed new Ward Fifteen.

The Chair rules again that Councilman Almagno's Amendment is not in order and

Councilman Pearlman appeals the Ruling of the Chair.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE STRAVATO Requests that the President give the Councilman time to draw the lines for the boundaries for Ward Fifteen.

RECESS

COUNCIL PRESIDENT LYNCH declares that the Council stand at Ease at 9:30 o'clock P.M. (E.S.T.) for a reasonable period of time in order to allow Councilman Almagno an opportunity to prepare the proper lines as they refer to a portion of Ward Fifteen.

Whereas, In compliance with said Report and Order of the Public Utilities Commission, the Water Supply Board of the City of Providence has engaged the services of an accounting firm to set up the practices and procedures to establish a separate "enterprise fund" accounting system; and

Whereas, The taxpayers of the City of Provi-

dence have the burden with the responsibilities and risks connected with the acquisition, ownership maintenance, and management of the system, including the pledge of the full faith and credit of the City of Providence on outstanding general obligation bonds; and

Whereas, The City of Providence should be granted reasonable compensation for services and real estate rentals furnished by the City of Providence to the said Water Supply Board; and

Whereas, An Act will soon be introduced in the General Assembly in the State of Rhode Island which provides that the Public Utilities Commission shall allow the City of Providence reasonable compensation for services and real estate rentals furnished by the City of Providence to the Water Supply Board in its function of providing water (copy of said proposed act attached hereto and marked "Exhibit A")
