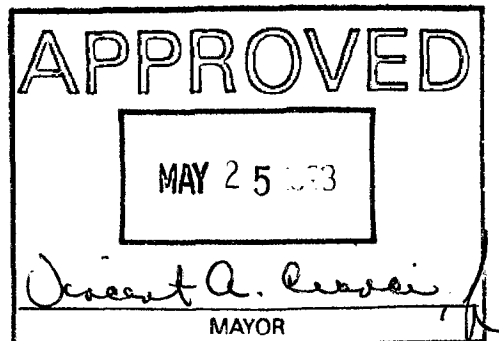

JOINT RESOLUTION

CREATING A SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE
COMMISSION TO STUDY WHOLESALE INVENTORY
TAX WITHIN THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE

Introduced By: *Senator Wulsten*
Date Introduced: *February 11, 1993*
Referred To: *Special Legislation*

1 RESOLVED, That a special legislative commission be and the same
2 is hereby created consisting of eleven (11) members: three (3) of whom
3 shall be from the house of representatives, not more than two (2) from
4 the same political party to be appointed by the speaker; two (2) of
5 whom shall be from the senate, not more than one (1) from the same
6 political party, to be appointed by the majority leader; one (1) of
7 whom shall be the tax assessor of the city of Providence, or his des-
8 ignee; one (1) of whom shall be the mayor of the city of Providence,
9 or his designee; one (1) of whom shall be the chairperson of the
10 Providence City Council Finance Committee, or his designee; and three
11 (3) of whom shall be members of the general public, to be appointed by
12 the mayor of the city of Providence.

13 In lieu of any appointment of a member of the legislature to a
14 permanent advisory commission, a legislative study commission, or any
15 commission created by a general assembly resolution, the appointing
16 authority may appoint a member of the general public to serve in lieu
17 of a legislator, provided that the majority leader or the minority

1 leader of the political party which is entitled to the appointment
2 consents to the appointment of the member of the general public.

3 The purpose of said commission shall be to study wholesale inven-
4 tory tax within the city of Providence.

5 Forthwith upon passage of this resolution, the members of the
6 commission shall meet at the call of the speaker of the house and
7 organize and shall select from among the legislators a chairperson.
8 Vacancies in said commission shall be filled in like manner as the
9 original appointment.

10 The membership of said commission shall receive no compensation
11 for their services.

12 All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such
13 advice and information, documentary and otherwise, to said commission
14 and its agents as is deemed necessary or desirable by the commission
15 to facilitate the purposes of this resolution.

16 The speaker of the house is hereby authorized and directed to
17 provide suitable quarters for said commission; and be it further

18 RESOLVED, That the commission shall report its findings and
19 recommendations to the general assembly on or before February 12, 1994
20 and said commission shall expire on April 12, 1994.
