WHEREAS, as an athlete, he swam in competition for Joslin Pool and Olneyville Boy's Club and won many trophies.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT in order to perpetuate the memory of this young fallen hero, who left legions of friends within the community in which he lived all his formative years, distinguished himself by being the recipient of The Purple Heart, The Military Merit Medal, The Gallantry Cross With Palm and other Vietnam Medals, that the Joslin Swimming Pool be named Lance Corporal John F. Kanaczet, Jr. Memorial Pool.



Request your assistance in determining current status of the land upon which Dutton's former office building still stands.


This land was a part of the property which was returned to the City when Dutton renewed his lease. Steelmet subsequently leased the balance of the property but not including the office building site.

This situation is somewhat complex as I am unsure as to what action property committee took last year with respect to this piece of property and adjacent pieces of property. As far as I can see, no one has been paying for the lease of this property during this year and I am not convinced that this building is Dutton's to sell.

Please advise as to a recommended course of action to process Steelmet's request to lease.

For your information and proper coordination with the City Solicitor and the City Property Committee, please be advised that Steelmet Corporation desires to lease 4,003 square feet of land within the Port of Providence for the purpose of establishing an office complex.

Mr. Lynwood P. Reid will provide you with an appropriate diagram specifying the exact location.

Preliminary negotiation establish the lease rate at \$640.48 per year. The term of the lease will coincide with the term of the existing Steelmet lease.

It is furthermore understood from Mr. Arnold Weinstein that Steelmet has purchased the office building located on this site from A.C. Dutton Lumber Company. Appropriate mention should therefore be made as to the disposition of this building at the termination of this lease.

AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF AND IN ADDITION TO CHAPTERS 45-32-5
45-33-2 AND 45-3-11 OF THE GENERAL LAWS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 45-32-5 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding thereto the following paragraph to be denominated (hh) to be inserted between Paragraph h and Paragraph i - "(hh) To undertake and carry out code enforcement projects pursuant to the provisions of appropriate federal legislation."

SECTION 2. Chapter 45-33-2 of the General Laws is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Bonds of city or town. - The legislative body may also authorize the issuance of general obligation or revenue bonds to provide moneys to be used by the Agency to carry out a redevelopment plan for a specific project area or for code enforcement projects carried on pursuant to the provision of appropriate federal legislation and shall provide that any portion of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds not required to carry out said redevelopment plan if issued for such purpose shall be returned to the community and shall be used to pay the principal and interest on any bonds of said issue outstanding and any surplus then remaining shall be transferred to the bond redemption fund of the community.

Such bonds shall be issued and sold at such times, in such amounts, with such maturities and other terms and in such form as the legislative body shall determine. Irrespective of any limitation, by general or special law, as to the amount of such bonds which may be issued, a community may issue such bonds, for the purposes defined by this section, in excess of such limitation in such amount as may be approved by the voters of such community at any general or special election, and all bonds issued under this section shall be exempted from the operation of 45-12-2. The community shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the

interest upon its general obligation bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this section, and also to pay the principal of such bonds maturing in any such year, until said bonds are paid in full. This section shall constitute statutory approval for the incurring of debt for the purposes of Chapters 31 to 33, inclusive, of this title wherever such approval is required by any general or special law."

SECTION 3. Chapter 45-33-11 of the General Laws is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Recitals as to purpose of bonds. - In any suit, action or proceedings involving the validity or enforceability of any bonds of an agency or the security thereof, any such bond reciting in substance that it has been issued by the agency to aid in financing a redevelopment project or for code enforcement projects shall be conclusively deemed to have been issued for a redevelopment project of such character and said project shall be conclusively deemed to have been planned, located and constructed in accordance with the purposes and provisions of Chapters 31 to 33, inclusive, of this title, or, if issued for a code enforcement project or projects shall be conclusively deemed to have been issued for a code enforcement project or projects of such character, and such project or projects shall be conclusively deemed to have been planned, located and carried out in accordance with the purposes and provisions of appropriate federal legislation."

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
