Work experience:

The Miriam Hospital 1980 until July of 2008.

I am a recently retired registered nurse, having spent my entire career at the Miriam Hospital. My most recent position was that of a navigator in the Comprehensive Cancer Center, a position that I piloted and performed pro bono for more than two years before accessing a grant for this newly established position. A navigator's role is that of teacher, social worker, advocate and friend to the patient and family. When the position became granted, the focus of it was to assist with the medically uninsured and underserved population. I served in this role for two and half years and left after the death of my husband.
