In view of the extremely low volume of traffic using the street, it is the considered opinion of this department that no prohibitions of the type requested should be installed at this time.

Gentlemen:

Yesterday afternoon a seven year old child sustained head injuries and was hospitalized after having been struck by an automobile on College Road.

Without comment on the circumstances of the particular accident, we submit that College Road being less than five hundred feet in length and there being twenty-three children of school age or younger living on the street, reasonable measures should be taken to minimize the threat to their safety by the use of the street for through traffic.

Since the installation of the traffic control signals at the corner of Eaton Street and River Avenue, automobile traffic through College Road has increased considerably.

The increase has been due in large part to motorists traveling southerly on River Avenue (and desiring to proceed westerly on Eaton Street) using College Road as a cut off to avoid stopping at the intersection of River Avenue and Eaton Street.

We believe then, that much of the unnecessary traffic can be reasonably eliminated, with little inconvenience to anyone, by the posting of a sign at the corner of River Avenue and College Road forbidding a right turn on to College Road from River Avenue.

We ask that you take the steps required for the posting of such a sign.
