
Gentlemen:

We have completed our investigation of your request for a study of the need for installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Prairie Avenue and Thurbers Avenue.

Our traffic signal installations are allocated on a priority basis, determined by such factors as traffic volume, pedestrian volume, accident hazard and physical layout. Although we anticipate that this intersection will require signalization at some future time, there are many other non-signalized intersections in the City which have priority over this intersection on the basis of the above factors.

Therefore, we recommend that the existing stop sign control of traffic continue to be used in preference to the immediate signalization of this intersection.




Gentlemen:

With reference to your request for the installation of "Stop" signs at the intersection of Forest Street and Ivy Street, we have recently completed an investigation at this intersection at the request of a citizen.

Neither of these streets are through streets so that the traffic which they carry is mostly local in nature. In addition, the volume of traffic is low and there have been only 3 reported accidents in the past three years.

Therefore, we recommend that the existing control by "Yield" signs be continued.


