

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 580

Approved November 25, 1974

WHEREAS, forty-one States in the United States of America, have currently restored the celebration of the cessation of World War I to November 11th, the actual anniversary date in 1918, and

WHEREAS, to all Veterans of that War, November 11th, at the 11th hour of the 11th month of the calendar, is a most significant and poignant date in their lives, and

WHEREAS, there is a considered movement in the Congress of the United States to pay tribute on that day to Veterans of World War I,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that His Honor the Mayor and the City Council do hereby endorse any legislation that may come before the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island, and in the Congress of the United States of America, whereby Armistice Day will be restored to its original anniversary date of November 11, of each succeeding year, that the Veterans of World War I, in America, be properly remembered, since it was they who earned that holiday.
