RESOLVED, DECREED AND ORDERED:

That the following named highways shown as shaded areas on the accompanying plan entitled "Providence, Rhode Island, Department of Public Works-Engineering Office, Street Line Section Map No. 063598, dated January 24, 1973,"

viz:

Howard Street(entire) from the southerly line of Broadway to the northerly line of Westminster Street, Area A, B, C, D, Hill Street (entire) from extreme westerly line to extreme easterly line, Area E, F, G, H, and J, K, L, M, having ceased to be useful to the public and the same are abandoned as public highways and the damage to the abutters is appraised at nothing and so awarded, and it is further

ORDERED, that the Director of Public Works, be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highways abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words "Not a Public Highway," and it is further

ORDERED, that after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highways which have been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.



Gentlemen:

This petition from the Committee on Public Works proposes the abandonment of Howard St. in its entirety from Broadway to Westminster St. and the remaining section of Hill St. which crosses Howard St. in Plat No. 35.

The land on the west of the proposed abandonment is owned by the State of Rhode Island and the Providence Redevelopment Agency. The land on the east is owned entirely by the Providence Redevelopment Agency. This property is in the final stages of being cleared. The proposed reuse of the entire site is commercial.


Traffic which presently would use Howard St. would use Barton St. which is parallel and immediately to the east of Howard St. Barton St. will be widened and made to accommodate two way traffic for this purpose.
