EFFECTIVE February 12, 2018

RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby respectfully request that the Director of the Department of Public Works develop and submit to the City Council a traffic calming plan for Eaton Street, from Smith Street to Douglas Avenue, specifically addressing issues related to the installation, modification, and funding of traffic calming infrastructure, and high volume pedestrian crosswalks, such as those located where Eaton Street intersects with Nelson Street, Huxley Avenue, Tyndall Avenue, and Pinehurst Avenue.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, within ninety (90) days, the aforementioned traffic calming plan shall be submitted to the City Council.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, upon passage, copies of this resolution shall be sent to the Director of Public Works and the Traffic Engineer.

The following memo is a response to resolution 2 to be heard at the 1/17/18 Public Works Committee Meeting

1. Resolution Requesting the Director of the Department of Public Works develop a Traffic Calming Plan for Eaton Street.

Response: We have begun the traffic study for Eaton St. and have compiled accident data and performed traffic and speed counts. We can commit to providing a conceptual plan and report to the City Council in 10 weeks. We have committed to installing stop signs on Eaton St. at Sharon St. once stop bars can be striped at the new stop signs on Eaton St. That striping is anticipated to be done in the Spring of this year. Traffic Engineering has recently installed stop signs on Eaton St. at Elmhurst Ave. and installed a rectangular rapid flashing beacon at the Eaton St./Jastram St. intersection.
