

## A G R E E M E N T

WHEREAS, an act entitled "An act in amendment of, and in addition to, Chapter 1443 of the Public Laws of 1929," passed at the January Session of the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island, A. D. 1931, and numbered Chapter 1779, authorized and empowered cities and towns owning ratable property devoted to public use located within any other city or town to enter into an agreement fixing, for a period not exceeding five years at one time, the amount and value of such property for the purposes of taxation; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed for the best interests of the City of Providence and of the Town of Scituate that an agreement be entered into fixing the value of the ratable property of the City of Providence located in the Town of Scituate under the authority contained in said act.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto:

That for the assessment of town valuations as of December 31, A. D. 1970 and for the next four succeeding dates of assessment of town valuations by the Tax Assessors of the Town of Scituate on the ratable property located in said town on said dates of assessment of town valuations, the valuation of the ratable property owned by the City of Providence and located in said Town of Scituate on said dates is hereby fixed at Thirteen Million Seven Hundred Eighteen Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty (\$13,718,750) Dollars and shall remain so fixed regardless of any increase or decrease in the valuation of the ratable property of the City of Providence located in said Town of Scituate during said period. This agreement shall cover and include all assessments to be made by the Town of Scituate on the ratable property of the City of Providence located therein for five years.

It is further agreed that in making said assessment the Assessors of Taxes of said Town of Scituate shall not be required to list each parcel separately and shall not be required to list land, buildings and other improvements and tangible personal property in separate columns.

The Town of Scituate hereby agreed not to carry on its assessment rolls during said period any sum other than the amount above stated.


Dear Sir:


