IN AMENDMENT OF CLAUSE 1 OF SECTION XI OF CHAPTER 598 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS, AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE PROBATE COURT OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Clause 1 of section XI of chapter 598 of the public laws of 1866, as amended by chapter 371 of the public laws of 1896, as further amended by chapter 692 of the public laws of 1925, as further amended by chapter 1444 of the public laws of 1929, as continued by section 133 of chapter 832 of the public laws of 1940 and amended by chapter 1482 of the public laws of 1944, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SECTION XI

"Clause 1. The court having probate jurisdiction in and for the city of Providence shall be hereafter known as the 'Probate court of the city of Providence.' It shall be holden by one judge, who shall be a member of the bar of the state of Rhode Island, and who shall be elected by the city council; he shall hold regular terms at such times and in such place in said city as may be appointed by ordinance of the city council, and may adjourn his court from time to time. There shall be a clerk of said court, who shall be a member of the bar of the state of Rhode Island and who shall be elected by the city council. The city council at its first regular meeting in November 1959 and at the first regular meeting in November in each sixth year thereafter shall elect a judge and a clerk of the probate court of the city of Providence, respectively, to hold office for the term of six years and until their respective successors are elected and qualify. Such election shall be made only from those candidates who shall have been nominated for these respective offices at the first regular meeting of the city council in the

October immediately preceding the election. Whenever any person thus nominated for the office of judge or clerk shall at any time before the time of election die, decline or otherwise become unable or ineligible for election, additional candidates may be nominated at the meeting at which the election takes place, and the election shall be made from all candidates including those nominated at the October meeting. The election of the judge and clerk shall be in open meeting by viva voce vote on roll call. Upon the election of a clerk, such clerk shall appoint a deputy clerk of said court, subject to the approval of said city council who shall hold office until his successor is appointed, approved by the city council, and qualified. Such deputy clerk need not be a member of the bar of the State of Rhode Island. In case of the sickness, absence from the city, disability or ineligibility of the judge of the probate court, or in the interim between any vacancy in said office and the filling of said vacancy, the clerk of the probate court shall have all his powers and duties, and said clerk shall certify upon the records of said court the days and dates upon which, and the occasion for which, the duties of the judge are performed by the said clerk. In the absence or disability of the clerk of said court or during such time as said clerk may be acting as judge of said court, or in the interim between any vacancy in said office and the filling of said vacancy, the deputy clerk of said court shall have all the powers and duties of the clerk of said court, except that such deputy clerk shall not in any circumstances be eligible to act as judge of said court. In case of vacancy in the office of either judge, clerk or deputy clerk of the probate court, whether such vacancy arises because of death, resignation, or for any other reason, like proceedings shall be had to fill such vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term, as in the case of the original election or appointment of such officers."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The City Treasurer has received an offer made by Kuzma Laptik of \$284.66 for Lot No. 92 on Plat No. 69 and as the period for the redemption of this property has expired, this offer is hereby approved in accordance to the law thereto appertaining.

If said real estate shall not be redeemed within said thirty days, the City Treasurer is hereby authorized to sell and convey to the said Kuzma Laptik for the price herein approved.


SUBJECT: Referral No. 549 - REDEMPTION OF LOT 92 ON ASSESSOR'S
