Whereas, In order to make said improvements, Washington Street must become a two-way street with two striped vehicle lanes,

appropriate turning lanes and sufficient on-street parking.

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the Providence City Council resolves that Washington Street be a two-way street, from Service Road #7 easterly to Kennedy Plaza, in accordance with the plans set forth by the Department of Planning and Development and the requirements of the Department of Public Safety, and

Be it further Resolved, That His Honor, the Mayor, is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents relative to the promulgation and implementation of the aforementioned activities.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Resolution Granting approval of two connections to the existing City of Providence drainage system at Agnes/Magnolia Streets in the vicinity of the former Harris Lumber site.

Whereas, The State of Rhode Island, Department of Transportation, is constructing the Freight Rail Improvement Project (FRIP); and

Whereas, Inter alia, FRIP seeks to add a third track for freight services along the northeast rail corridor; and

Whereas, That improvement and some ancillary construction require improved drainage; and

Whereas, The upgraded drainage can best be

had by connection of the improvement to the existing municipal system,

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the State of Rhode Island, Department of Transportation may, in connection with the FRIP, utilize and connect to the existing municipal drainage system located at Agnes and Magnolia Streets at or near the former "Harris Lumber Yard," so-called.

Said grant is specifically and precedentially conditioned upon the following:

1. Said connection shall be utilized only for the drainage from the "third rail" of FRIP, and for no other purposes.
2. Petitioner shall conduct all environmental testing and remediation required by any municipal, state or federal agency.
3. Said connection shall be subject to a right of reverter/right of reversion in the event that the connection is no longer utilized for the aforesated purposes.
4. Any necessary installation and/or repair or replacement shall be to the approval of the Director of the Department of Public Works and of the Director of Inspection and Standards. Additionally, Petitioner shall notify the Director of Public Works, the Chief of the Fire Department, the Chief of the Police Department, and the Traffic Engineer, of the start of construction two (2) weeks before start of the same. Additionally, the Petitioner shall coordinate any necessary traffic control with the Traffic Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Safety.
5. Petitioner shall ascertain that the connection results in no adverse impact on any

existing drainage capacity has quality and shall ensure the continued integrity of the drainage system existing.

6. State of Rhode Island, Department of Transportation, shall execute an indemnification and hold-harmless agreement with the City of Providence. Said agreement shall be approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

7. FRIP shall supply the City of Providence with an insurance policy naming said City of Providence, its agents, officers, servants and employees as additional-named insureds in a sum not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or suitable evidence of self-insurance, either of which shall be approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

8. Grantee shall not lay, construct or affix to the drainage system any temporary or permanent structure other than that described earlier herein. Further, Grantee shall, at its own expense, maintain the drainage duct so that the same complies with all regulations and remains in good working order.

9. The State of Rhode Island, Department of Transportation, recognizes the applicability of Sections 23-107, 23-108 and 23-190 of the Code of Ordinances which read as follows:

23-107. *Indemnity of city against claims arising out of electrical installations.* No right of any person to maintain, use or operate any poles, wires, cables, conduits, ducts, pipes, manholes, handholes, or other appliances or appurtenances in any street or other traveled way in the city, shall be in preference or hindrance of public work in the city, and should any of the same in any way interfere with the

construction, alteration or repair of any public work in, under, or over any such street or way, whether done by the city directly or by any contractor for the city, such person shall at his own expense protect, alter or move any of the same so interfering to some other location, or discontinue the use and operation thereof for the time being, as directed by the director of public works, without the city being liable for any damages suffered by such person thereby. The City shall notify such person not fewer than ninety (90) days prior to such public work, which will interfere with any of the same or the use or operation thereof. In case such person shall fail to comply with any such direction of said director, the city may protect, alter or move the same, and recover the cost thereof from such person.

23-108. *Precedence of wires, apparatus of city signal service.* The wires, poles, posts, structures and supports of the telephone, fire alarm and police signal service maintained by the city shall at all times take precedence and right-of-way as to all other wires, poles, posts, structures and supports maintained or erected in the city; and no lineman or other person, either in erecting wires, poles, posts, structures or supports in any way whatsoever shall interfere with, or disturb, disarrange or change any wires maintained by the city, or any appurtenance thereof; and in every instance of removal of any of said wires, poles, posts, structures or supports for the accommodation of any other corporation or party, or to place the same beyond danger from the electric current of any other corporation or party, the expense from the electric current or any other corporation or party, the expense incident to said removal shall be paid immediately by such other corporation or party.

23-109. *Indemnity of city against claims*

arising out of electrical installation. Every person erecting, maintaining or using electric wires or poles, fixture or structures, for the support or conducting of the same shall indemnify and save harmless the city, its officers, agents and servants, from and against all lawful claims and demands for injuries to persons or property occasioned by the existence of such poles, wires, fixtures or structures or the transmission of electric current by means thereof or by the digging up, opening or keeping open of any street, highway, traveled way, public place or part thereof, which shall be or has been opened for the purpose of installing, constructing or repairing any underground conduit, duct, structure, appliance or appurtenance by or for such person, or by any failure of such person to restore and keep in sound and safe condition for the required time any ground opened or dug up in the prosecution of any of its work in any street, way or place. The city, city council, or the officers, agents or servants of the city, exercising the rights, powers or permission, and subject to the restrictions, respectively given and reserved herein shall not be held liable by such person or corporation on account thereof, or by reason of any injury or damage caused thereby.

10. In addition to Paragraph 9 above, in the event that the City of Providence or its designee shall, for any public purpose, require the extinguishment of any right created herein and upon the ninety (90) days notice hereinbefore

mentioned, State of Rhode Island, Department of Transportation, shall, at its own expense, remove said improvements to the easement area.

11. Such other terms and conditions as may be reflected in the record and minutes of the City Council Committee on Public Property and/or as may be deemed appropriate by the Mayor or the Department of Law.

1. Said easement shall be utilized only for the installation and maintenance of fiber optic conduit. Said easement shall not exceed the area of one hundred forty-seven feet by two feet by three feet and indicated by the cross-hatched area on the accompanying maps marked as Exhibit A.

2. Said easement shall be deemed to run with the land and shall operate against any successors in title and the easement or

memorandum of same shall be recorded in the Office of Land Records for the City of Providence.

3. Said easement shall be subject to a right of reverter/right of reversion in the event that the situs of the easement is no longer utilized for the aforesated purposes. Additionally, it shall be for a term of not more than twenty (20) years.

4. Fibertech shall tender the sum of five hundred ninety dollars (\$590.00) in legal tender of the United States of America.

5. Any breakout necessary for installation and/or repair shall be resurfaced/rehabilitated to the approval of the Director of the Department of Public Works.

6. Any installation of utilities or utility lines shall be underground so as to preserve the public right-of-way.

9. Fibertech shall execute an indemnification and hold-harmless agreement with the City of Providence. Said agreement shall be approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

10. Fibertech shall supply the City of Providence with an insurance policy naming the City of Providence, its agents, officers, servants and employees as additional-named insureds in a sum not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) which policy shall be approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

11. Fibertech shall not lay, construct or affix to the realty any temporary or permanent structure other than described earlier herein.

12. Fibertech recognizes the applicability of Sections 23-107, 23-108 and 23-190 of the Code of Ordinances which read as follows:

23-107. *Indemnity of city against claims arising out of electrical installations.* No right of any person to maintain, use or operate any poles, wires, cables, conduits, ducts, pipes, manholes, handholes, or other appliances or appurtenances in any street or other traveled way in the city, shall be in preference or hindrance of public work in the city, and should any of the same in any way interfere with the construction, alteration or repair of any public work in, under, or over any such street or way,

whether done by the city directly or by any contractor for the city, such person shall at his own expense protect, alter or move any of the same so interfering to some other location, or discontinue the use and operation thereof for the time being, as directed by the director of public works, without the city being liable for any damages suffered by such person thereby. The City shall notify such person not fewer than ninety (90) days prior to such public work, which will interfere with any of the same or the use or operation thereof. In case such person shall fail to comply with any such direction of said director, the city may protect, alter or move the same, and recover the cost thereof from such person.

23-108. *Precedence of wires, apparatus of city signal service.* The wires, poles, posts, structures and supports of the telephone, fire alarm and police signal service maintained by the city shall at all times take precedence and right-of-way as to all other wires, poles, posts, structures and supports maintained or erected in the city; and no lineman or other person, either in erecting wires, poles, posts, structures or supports in any way whatsoever shall interfere with, or disturb, disarrange or change any wires maintained by the city, or any appurtenance thereof; and in every instance of removal of any said wires, poles, posts, structures or supports for the accommodation of any other corporation or party, or to place the same beyond danger from the electric current of any other corporation or party, the expense incident to said removal shall be paid immediately by such other corporation or party.

23-109. *Indemnity of city against claims arising out of electrical installation.* Every person erecting, maintaining or using electric wires or poles, fixture or structures, for the support or conducting of the same shall

The city, the city council, or the officers, agents or servants of the city, exercising the rights, powers or permission, and subject to the restrictions, respectively given and reserved herein shall not be held liable by such person or corporation on account thereof, or by reason of any injury or damage caused thereby.

on Angell Street to Wayland Avenue; thence southerly on Wayland Avenue to South Angell Street; thence southeasterly on South Angell Street to the Henderson Bridge; thence easterly across Henderson Bridge to the Providence-East Providence boundary line in the Seekonk River; thence southwesterly along the Providence-East Providence boundary line to the Providence River; thence northwesterly through the Providence River to the point of origin.

SECOND WARD

thence easterly on Union Avenue to Service Road; thence northerly on Service Road to a line extended southeasterly to Union Avenue; thence southeasterly along that line (boundary line between census blocks 440070013003009 and 440070013003008) to Union Avenue; thence northeasterly on Union Avenue to Messer Street; thence southeasterly on Messer Street to Hanover Street; thence continuing southeasterly on Hanover Street to Dexter Street; thence northeasterly on Dexter Street to Cromwell Street; thence easterly on Cromwell Street to Elmwood Avenue; thence southeasterly on Elmwood Avenue to Rhode Island Route 10; thence southeasterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to the Providence-Cranston boundary line; thence northwesterly along the Providence-Cranston boundary line to Rhode Island Route 10; thence northerly on Rhode Island Route 10 to the point of origin.

NINTH WARD

The Ninth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Elmwood Avenue and Stanwood Street; thence easterly on Stanwood Street to Public Street; thence northeasterly on Public Street to Broad Street; thence southeasterly on Broad Street to the Providence-Cranston boundary line; thence southwestly and northwesterly along the Providence-Cranston boundary line to Rhode Island Route 10; thence northwesterly along the Rhode Island Route 10 to Elmwood Avenue; thence continuing northwesterly on Elmwood Avenue to the point of origin.

TENTH WARD

The Tenth Ward of the City of Providence

shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Broad Street and Reynolds Avenue; thence northeasterly on Reynolds Avenue to Prairie Avenue; thence northwesterly on Prairie Avenue to Public Street; thence northeasterly on Public Street and its extension to the Providence-East Providence boundary line in the Providence River; thence southeasterly along the Providence-East Providence boundary line to the Providence-Cranston boundary line; thence westerly along the Providence-Cranston boundary line to Broad Street; thence northwesterly on Broad Street to the point of origin.

ELEVENTH WARD

The Eleventh Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by the line beginning at the intersection of Hanover Street and Cranston Street; thence northeasterly on Cranston Street to Westminster Street; thence continuing northeasterly on Westminster Street to Franklin Street; thence southeasterly on Franklin Street to Pond Street; thence northeasterly on Pond Street to Fenner Street; thence northwesterly on Fenner Street to Westminster Street; thence northeasterly on Westminster Street to Union Street; thence southeasterly on Union Street to Middle Street; thence northeasterly on Middle Street to Dorrance Street; thence northwesterly on Dorrance Street to Westminster Street; thence northeasterly on Westminster Street to the Providence River; thence southeasterly through the Providence River to its extension to Public Street; thence southwesterly on Public Street to Prairie Avenue; thence southeasterly on Prairie Avenue to Reynolds Street; thence southwest-erly on Reynolds Street to Broad Street; thence

northerly on Broad Street to Public Street; thence southwesterly on Public Street to Stanwood Street; thence westerly on Stanwood Street to Elmwood Avenue; thence northerly on Elmwood Avenue to Hanover Street; thence northwesterly on Hanover Street to Bucklin Street; thence northerly on Bucklin Street to Dexter Street; thence southwesterly on Dexter Street to Hanover Street; thence northwesterly on Hanover Street to the point of origin.

TWELFTH WARD

The Twelfth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Academy Avenue and Chalkstone Avenue; thence easterly on Chalkstone Avenue to Garfield Avenue; thence northerly and easterly on Garfield Avenue to Pleasant Valley Parkway; thence southeasterly on Pleasant Valley Parkway to Oakland Avenue; thence northeasterly on Oakland Avenue to Eaton Street; thence easterly on Eaton Street to Douglas Avenue; thence southeasterly on Douglas Avenue to a line extended northeasterly to Wiley Street; thence northeasterly along that line (boundary line between census blocks 440070026002012, 440070026002011, and 440070027003011) to Wiley Street; thence southeasterly on Wiley Street to Fillmore Street; thence northeasterly on Fillmore Street to Admiral Street; thence southeasterly on Admiral Street to Charles Street; thence continuing southeasterly on Charles Street to Stevens Street; thence continuing southeasterly on Stevens Street to Hewes Street; thence northeasterly on Hewes Street to North Main Street; thence southerly on North Main Street to Steeple Street; thence southwesterly on Steeple Street to Exchange Terrace; thence continuing southwesterly on Exchange Terrace

to Memorial Boulevard; thence westerly on Memorial Boulevard to Rhode Island Route 10; thence continuing westerly on Rhode Island Route 10 and its extension northerly to Acorn Street; thence northerly on Acorn Street to Promenade Street; thence westerly on Promenade Street to Hemlock Street; thence northwesterly on Hemlock Street to Valley Street; thence southwesterly on Valley Street to Harold Street; thence northerly on Harold Street to Aurora Street; thence southwesterly on Aurora Street to Rill Street; thence southeasterly on Rill Street to Boyd Street; thence westerly on Boyd Street to Allston Street; thence southerly on Allston Street to Cliff Street; thence westerly on Cliff Street to Cutler Street; thence southerly on Cutler Street to Newark Street; thence westerly on Newark Street to Academy Avenue; thence northerly on Academy Avenue to the point of origin.

THIRTEENTH WARD

The Thirteenth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Rhode Island Route 10 and the former New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad; thence northeasterly along the former New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad to Rhode Island Route 10; thence southwesterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to Harris Avenue; thence northeasterly on Harris Avenue to Atwells Avenue; thence easterly on Atwells Avenue to Rhode Island Route 10; thence continuing easterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to Memorial Boulevard; thence continuing easterly on Memorial Boulevard to Exchange Terrace; thence northeasterly on Exchange Terrace to the Providence River; thence southeasterly through the Providence River to Westminster Street; thence southwesterly on

Westminster Street to Dorrance Street; thence southeasterly on Dorrance Street to Middle Street; thence southwesterly on Middle Street to Union Street; thence northwesterly on Union Street to Westminster Street; thence southwesterly on Westminster Street to Fenner Street; thence southerly on Fenner Street to Pond Street; thence southwesterly on Pond Street to Franklin Street; thence northwesterly on Franklin Street to Westminster Street; thence southwesterly on Westminster Street to Cranston Street; thence continuing southwesterly on Cranston Street to Chapin Avenue; thence westerly on Chapin Avenue to Sycamore Street; thence northerly on Sycamore Street to Wood Street; thence westerly on Wood Street to Messer Street; thence northerly on Wood Street to Westminster Street; thence northeasterly on Westminster Street to Barton Street; thence northerly on Barton Street to Broadway; thence southwesterly on Broadway to Rhode Island Route 10; thence northeasterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to the point of origin.

FOURTEENTH WARD

The Fourteenth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of Wanskuck Avenue and the Providence-North Providence boundary line; thence northeasterly along the Providence-North Providence boundary line to Douglas Avenue; thence southeasterly on Douglas Avenue to Concannon Street; thence easterly on Concannon Street to Veazie Street; thence northeasterly on Veazie Street to Branch Avenue; thence southeasterly on Branch Avenue to Louisquisset Pike; thence continuing southeasterly on Louisquisset Pike to Hawkins Street; thence southwesterly on Hawkins Street to Yorkshire Street; thence northwesterly on

Yorkshire Street to Anchor Street; thence southwesterly on Anchor Street to Glasgow Street; thence northwesterly on Glasgow Street to Corina Street; thence southwesterly on Corina Street to Appian Street; thence southeasterly on Appian Street to Corina Street; thence southwesterly on Corina Street to Douglas Avenue; thence southeasterly on Douglas Avenue to Eaton Street; thence northwesterly on Eaton Street to River Avenue; thence southerly on River Avenue to Smith Street; thence northwesterly on Smith Street to Enfield Avenue; thence northerly on Enfield Avenue to Isabella Avenue; thence westerly on Isabella Avenue to Gentian Avenue; thence northeasterly on Gentian Avenue to Wanskuck Avenue; thence northwesterly on Wanskuck Avenue to the point of origin.

FIFTEENTH WARD

The Fifteenth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all of that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of United States Route 6 and the Woonasquatucket River; thence northeasterly and southeasterly along the Woonasquatucket River to Bosworth Street; thence northeasterly on Bosworth Street to Aleppo Street; thence southeasterly on Aleppo Street to Pelham Street; thence northeasterly on Pelham Street to Manton Avenue; thence northwesterly on Manton Avenue to Pope Street; thence northeasterly on Pope Street to Amherst Street; thence easterly on Amherst Street to Putnam Street; thence northerly on Putnam Street to Atwells Avenue; thence easterly on Atwells Avenue to Academy Avenue; thence northerly on Academy Avenue to Newark Street; thence easterly on Newark Street to Cutler Street; thence northerly on Cutler Street to Cliff Street; thence easterly on Cliff Street to Allston Street;

thence northerly on Allston Street to Boyd Street; thence easterly on Boyd Street to Rill Street; thence northwesterly on Rill Street to Aurora Street; thence northeasterly on Aurora Street to Harold Street; thence southeasterly on Harold Street to Valley Street; thence northeasterly on Valley Street to Hemlock Street; thence southeasterly on Hemlock Street to Promenade Street; thence easterly on Promenade Street to Acorn Street; thence southerly on Acorn Street to and its extension to Rhode Island Route 1C; thence westerly on Rhode Island Route 10 to Atwells Avenue; thence continuing westerly on Atwells Avenue to Harris Avenue; thence southwesterly on Harris Avenue to Rhode Island Route 10; thence northeasterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to the former New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad; thence southwesterly on New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad to Rhode Island Route 10; thence southwesterly on Rhode Island Route 10 to Broadway; thence northeasterly on Broadway to Barton Street; thence southerly on Barton Street to Westminster Street; thence westerly on Westminster Street to Messer Street; thence southerly on Messer Street to Wood Street; thence easterly on Wood Street to Sycamore Street; thence southerly on Sycamore Street to Chapin Avenue; thence easterly on Chapin Avenue to Cranston Street; thence southwesterly on Cranston Street to Messer Street; thence northwesterly on Messer Street to Union Avenue; thence southwesterly on Union Avenue to a line extended northwesterly to Service Road; thence northwesterly along that line (boundary line between census blocks 440070013003009 and 440070013003008) to Service Road; thence southerly on Service Road to Union Avenue; thence westerly on Union Avenue to Rhode Island Route 10; thence southerly on Rhode Island Route 10 to Providence-Cranston boundary line; thence northwesterly along the Providence-Cranston

boundary line to Terrace Avenue; thence northwesterly on Terrace Avenue to Laurel Hill Avenue; thence continuing northwesterly on Laurel Hill Avenue to Pocasset Avenue; thence northeasterly on Pocasset Avenue to southeasterly on Laban Street to Plainfield Street; thence easterly on Plainfield Street to United States Route 6; thence northwesterly on United States Route 6 to the point of origin.

Section 2. It shall be understood and intended that in bounding and describing the said Wards, that the said boundary lines of streets, streams, rivers and railroads is meant in all instances the central line of such street, stream, river or railroad, unless the same be otherwise specified.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes thereof and to apportion the City into fifteen wards in compliance with the Home Rule Charter of the City of Providence. It is intended that the fifteen wards described herein completely encompass all the area within the City and contain all the citizens residing in the City. It is further intended that the ward boundaries provided for in this Ordinance result in the creation of wards containing substantially equal population that natural boundaries be used and recognized neighborhoods be included within wards without arbitrary divisions thereof, so far as practicable.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage; provided, however, that the provisions hereof shall first be effective in connection with elections to be held on or subsequent to the first day of September, 2002,

and for the purpose of greater clarity, the first election under the provisions of this Ordinance for City Council Wards hereby created, shall be held on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November 2002, and the first primary election, under the provisions of this Ordinance for nomination of candidates for City Council from each of the fifteen wards shall be held on the second Tuesday after the first Monday in September 2002, provided, however that if any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to any court of competent jurisdiction, or if any action performed under any provision of this Ordinance is restrained or enjoined by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall not be deemed impaired or affected thereby but shall be deemed to remain in full force and effect.

Read and Passed the Second Time, on motion of COUNCILMAN ALLEN, seconded by COUNCILMAN BUTLER, by the following Roll Call Vote:
