ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinances were in City Council March 16, 1978, Read and Passed the First Time and Are Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance Authorizing the City Council of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, to File an Application for the Funding Under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, for Funds for the Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Funds for the Fiscal Year, 1979.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Whereas, The City of Providence is eligible to receive Community Development Block Entitlement Funds for the fiscal year, 1979 under Section 106(a) or (h) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, (Public Laws 93-383); and

Whereas, The said Application for Funding shall be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, not later than April 14, 1978.

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Providence, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island, hereby authorized the City of Providence, through its official representatives, the Mayor, to file an application for Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Funds for the fiscal year, 1979, under Section 106(a) or (h) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, (Public Laws 93-383) to do all acts necessary to successfully acquire said funds.

Section 2. All monies received by the City of Providence from the federal government under the provisions of Section 106(a) or (h) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, (Public Laws 93-383), shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of said Act. **The allocation and expenditure of funds under**

the Home Improvement for Providence section of the grant application shall be spent on a monthly parity system which will be established for the twelve housing impact areas to insure an even distribution of housing rehabilitation funds. Such system and method will insure an equal number of applicants serviced in the following parity areas:

Fox Point;

Joslin-Manton;

Mt. Hope;

North End;

Smith Hill;

West Side;

Elmwood;

South Providence;

Washington Park;

Silver Lake;

Federal Hill;

Mount Pleasant and

Elmhurst.

The Citizens Advisory Committee may comment on the plan for expenditure of funds so received. The City Council will consider the views of the Citizens Advisory Committee but it shall retain to itself the final approval for the expenditure of funds. No funds received under said Act

shall be allocated for specific projects nor expended without the approval of the City Council.

Section 3. The Mayor and City Council may require any and all information relative to the expenditure of Community Development Act funds and at any time conduct investigations pursuant to the existing provisions of the City Charter, and shall require that all employees of the said program shall be qualified electors and residents in the City of Providence, Rhode Island.

Section 4. Upon the written request of the City Council of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, names, addresses and salaries of all personnel engaged in this program shall be submitted to the said Council.

Section 5. There shall be submitted to the City Council and the Citizens Advisory Committee by the Finance Director of the Community Development Act, on a monthly basis a line item budget showing (a) Project Account, (b) Amount budgeted, (c) Amount expended, (d) balance.

Section 6. The Mayor shall submit to the City Council and the Citizens Advisory Committee on a Quarterly basis a narrative progress report on each program including supporting data.

Section 7. The Mayor shall be responsible for negotiating all contracts with outside agencies subject to approval by Ordinance of the City Council.

Section 8. Amendments to the Community Development Program during the program year necessitating the reallocation of funds or the designation of new activities shall be subject to at least one Public Hearing, review by the Citizens Advisory Committee and final approval by Ordinance of the City Council.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage by the City Council.

Resolution Honoring Edwin B. O'Reilly, M.D., Upon being the Recipient of the 1978 Ben Fish Award.

Whereas, Edwin B. O'Reilly, M.D. will be the recipient of the "Ben Fish Award" the evening of April 6, 1978, when he will be feted by his friends and associates including His Excellency J. Joseph Garrahy, Governor of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations for his life long dedication in providing medical care to his patients for over forty years, and

Whereas, Dr. O'Reilly graduated from LaSalle Academy in 1925 and received a Ph.D. Degree in 1930 from Providence College. In 1953 he received a Doctor of Medicine, Master of Surgery from McGill University Faculty of Medicine, Montreal, Canada, and

Whereas, Following his internship at Saint Joseph's Hospital, Providence, Dr. O'Reilly has been affiliated with Saint Joseph's Hospital since 1937, where during these 40 years he has held many positions within the structure of the hospital, formed and operated the Hematology and Diabetic Clinics, in conjunction with the late Father Hickey of Providence College and the late Dr. F. Burns, he initiated nuclear medicine at that hospital, served as Secretary-Treasurer and President of the Medical Staff and was Physician-in-Chief in 1955. His medical affiliations were also at Roger Williams Hospital from 1937 to 1975, and

Whereas, Upon opening his private office in August, 1937 for the General Practice of Medicine, he also began to take an active role in the community, when in association with the late Dr. F. Burns, Dr. O'Reilly formed the Student Health Services at his Alma Mater, Providence College in September, 1937, and was appointed the first Director of Student Health Services and has remained at the College in an active capacity for the past forty years, he received an Honorary Degree of Master of Arts in 1958, an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Law in 1965, and was also honored by the Mal Brown Club of the Providence College Alumni Association with the William J. McDonnell Award for service to Providence College, and

Whereas, He held Memberships in many professional and Civic Associations, and membership in the Providence and Rhode Island Medical Societies for approximately forty years, and

Whereas, In 1962, he joined the consulting staff at Vocational Rehabilitation and in 1965 he became Chief Medical Consultant for the agency while during these 16 years, Dr. O'Reilly has inspired the agency staff in providing timely and effective vocational rehabilitation services to the disabled population of Rhode Island, he fostered the use of new and innovative medical services in the field of rehabilitation to meet the unique needs of severely handicapped individuals, and

Whereas, Dr. O'Reilly recently philosophized about the medical delivery system and rehabilitation. He felt strongly that the Family Practitioner is the foundation of the medical profession, and that in rehabilitation, services should be liberalized and expanded as "hope springs eternal from the human breast",

Now, Therefore, be it Resolved, In honoring Edwin B. O'Reilly, M.D., with the 1978 "Ben Fish Award," he joins several deserving and distinguished honorees, starting from 1959 to the present date, the community in which he lives and still serves join in best wishes to him who has compiled nearly one half of a century of dedica-

tion to administering aid to the sick and afflicted, and

Be it further Resolved, That in sponsoring this Resolution on the professional Vita of Edwin B. O'Reilly, M.D., Councilman Ralph Fagnoli joins, with the City Council of Providence, in congratulating him upon being recognized for his contributions to the betterment of the health of his patients, and
