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AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 3726 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS, 1956 ENTITLED  
"AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO EXEMPT OFF-STREET PARKING  
STRUCTURES FROM TAXATION."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 3726 of the Public Laws, 1956, entitled "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Exempt Off-Street Parking Structures from Taxation" is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The city council of the city of Providence, by resolution or ordinance passed and approved at any time prior to April 26, 1968, may exempt from taxation for a period not exceeding twelve (12) years, any structure above or under the ground which may hereafter be constructed and located in such city and used by the public for the parking of automobiles off the street or highway, provided the construction of such structure results in at least a two hundred (200%) per cent increase in the parking capacity of the premises as they existed prior to erection of such structure, and provided further that the exemption shall be limited to that portion of the structure exclusively used for or devoted to the parking of automobiles and vehicles of that nature."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts, or parts of acts, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO MAKE RELOCATION PAYMENTS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1: The City of Providence is hereby authorized to provide by ordinance for making relocation payments to transients or eligible individuals, families and business concerns for moving expenses and property losses resulting from their displacement by any municipal project undertaken by the City after January 1, 1961. Said payments shall be subject to the following terms:

a. Definitions:

- 1) "Relocation payments" shall mean payments by a redevelopment agency to transients, eligible individuals or families and business concerns for their reasonable and necessary moving expenses and any actual direct losses of personal property to business concerns, except good will or profit, resulting from their displacement from any redevelopment project.
- 2) "Eligible individual or family" shall mean an individual or family owning furniture in housing accommodations.
- 3) "Individual" shall mean a person who is not a member of a family as defined below.
- 4) "Family" shall mean a group of two or more persons living together and related by blood, marriage or adoption; or two or more single persons not related by blood, marriage or adoption, who are living together in a single housekeeping unit.
- 5) "Transient" shall mean a displaced individual or family not owning furniture but occupying housing accommodations.
- 6) "Business concern" shall include a corporation, firm, partnership, individual, or other entity engaged in some type of business or profession necessitating fixtures, equipment, stock in trade, or other tangible property for the carrying on of the business or profession. Nonprofit organizations and institutions such as churches and hospitals are included.

7) "Occupied room" shall include all furnished rooms except bath-rooms, hallways and closets.

SEC. 2. Upon presentation of satisfactory evidence of the fact of relocation, there may be paid to each individual, transient, or family, a sum of money in accordance with a schedule of payments based upon the number of occupied rooms. In the case of business concerns, the sum of money to be paid shall be based upon the actual necessary moving expense incurred and any direct losses sustained to personal property, but not goods kept for sale, good will or profit. Such payments shall be made subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed, and shall not exceed TWO HUNDRED (\$200) DOLLARS in the case of each transient, individual or family, or THREE THOUSAND (\$3,000) DOLLARS in the case of each business concern.

SEC. 3. The City of Providence shall provide by ordinance for carrying out the provisions of this Act and shall designate some official, board, commission or agency to administer the same, including among other things, the power and authority to set up the schedule of payments and all rules and regulations as to said payments.

SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.

A N A C T

IN ALLEVIATION OF CHAPTER 2036 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1943  
RELATIVE TO THE LICENSING OF THE LICENSING OF, GRANTING AND  
RENEWAL OF VEHICLE REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES, PERSONS IN  
THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE ADMINISTERING THE BUREAU OF LICENSING  
TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of Chapter 2036 of the Public

Laws of 1943 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3. Said city council of the city of Providence  
is hereby expressly authorized to delegate the licensing  
power herein vested in said city council and the enforce-  
ment of any ordinance in pursuance thereof to the Bureau  
of Licenses of said city which said power to make rules  
and regulations with respect to persons, places and the  
licensing thereof not otherwise inconsistent with law.

Said city council is further authorized to establish  
fees or a system of fees for said licenses.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and  
all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby  
repealed.
