RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 1900

Approved September 23, 1968

RESOLVED,

That in accordance with the provisions of Section 28, Chapter 1665 of the Public Laws of 1945, approved April 27, 1945, the City Controller is hereby authorized and directed to establish in the accounts for the year ending September 30, 1968, a specific purpose account to be known as "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the year 1968-1969". Said account shall be established by charging to the account entitled "Current Year Surplus" of the accounts of 1967-1968, an amount equal to any credit balance existing in said Current Year Surplus account at the close of the fiscal year. After completion of the above transfer, any balance existing in the account entitled "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the Year 1968-1969" shall be carried over to the books of account for the year 1968-1969.

From time to time during the year ending September 30, 1969, the City Council, when necessary, may direct the City Controller and the City Treasurer to pay out of General Fund Cash the total or any part of the then credit balance existing in the account entitled "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the Year 1968-1969", each such payment shall be charged to said account and shall immediately be paid over to the City Collector as a receipt account, and when so received by him, shall be credited to a receipt account to be entitled "Receipts for Extraordinary Expenditures of the year 1968-1969".

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 97

Approved September 23, 1968

Whereas, The City of Providence, Rhode Island desires to acquire and develop certain land in the vicinity of the Kenyon Street Elementary School, which land is to be held and used for permanent recreation or conservation land as a playground; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence, Rhode Island intends to apply to the State of Rhode Island, Department of Natural Resources for Green Acres funds to cover approximately \$106,420.00 of the local share; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the City cash contribution will be approximately \$106,420.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND:

1. That an application be made to the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development for a grant in an amount authorized by Title VII of the Housing Act of 1961, as amended, which amount is presently estimated to be \$212,840.00, and that the Applicant will pay the balance of the cost from other funds available to it.
2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and to file such application with the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as are required by said department, to execute such documents as are required by said department, and to act as the authorized correspondent of the Applicant.
3. That the proposed acquisition and development is in accordance with plans for the allocation of land for open-space uses, and that, should said grant be made, the Applicant will acquire, develop, and retain said land for the uses designated in said application or approved by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development.
4. That the United States of America and the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development Administrator be, and they hereby are, assured of full compliance by the Applicant with regulations of the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

MEMORANDUM

TO: Charles R. Wood, Supervisor of Current Planning

SUBJECT: Playground at Kenyon Street in the Federal Hill
Neighborhood
DATE: August 5, 1968

This memorandum is in response to your request that this section locate a site, prepare preliminary cost figures and determine financing methods for a playground in the Kenyon Street area.

The Federal Hill East Redevelopment Plan proposes a 5.6 acre recreation complex bounded by Kenyon Street, America Street, Africa Street and DePasquale Avenue. See attached sheet 1. The cost to acquire this entire area, at this time, would run close to a million dollars. To comply with future plans for this area a portion of the larger site (2.2 acres) is being recommended for acquisition and development at this time. See attached sheet 2. This site will include a ball field, a basketball court and play equipment for younger children. See attached sheet 3.

The estimated cost of acquisition and development for this site is \$425,680. The cost and financing details are as follows:




FEDERAL HILL EAST PROJECT PROPOSED RECREATION AREA




