Dear Mr. Vespia:

President Nixon has asked that we reply to your Providence City Council Resolution of May 2 expressing concern over the plight of Jews in Iraq and other Arab countries, a concern which we share.

Secretary Rogers, after the public execution on January 27 of fourteen Iraqi citizens reportedly convicted of espionage, stated, "on humanitarian grounds these executions are a matter of concern to us. The spectacle of mass public executions is repugnant to the conscience of the world."

Immediately after the executions, we began efforts to persuade the Iraqi Government to let its Jewish citizens who wish leave the country. Direct appeals by the United States are not possible because Iraq and a number of Arab states broke diplomatic relations with us after the June 1967 war. Therefore, we are urging other countries to persuade Iraq to permit Jewish emigration.

Because of deep Arab suspicion of any US efforts to help the Jews, we are carefully avoiding statements or acts that could provoke the Arabs into reacting against Jews in Arab countries.
