RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved October 25, 1975

WHEREAS, the Providence Hebrew Day School, located along Elmgrove Avenue, is in close proximity to heavily motor vehicle traveled Brown University Stadium; Marvel Gymnasium and the Jewish Community Center, which are attended by students, starting with pre-teenaged groups, and

WHEREAS, travel over and across this portion of Elmgrove Avenue, particularly from the vicinity of Wayland Square, is a Thorough-Fare which has a slight curve and therefore the school site does not come into view until it approaches the immediate vicinity of the said school,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Traffic Engineer is requested to cause the installation of a Traffic Control Signal Light along Elmgrove Avenue, southerly and in close proximity to the Providence Hebrew Day School.

Dear Tom,

We are writing to you as concerned parents of three students at the Providence Hebrew Day School.

We have recently noticed that most schools have a blinking light which is activated at crucial hours of the school day (e.g. 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.) to warn oncoming cars to slow down for children who might be crossing the street.

Coming down Elmgrove Avenue from the Wayland Square direction, the street curves slightly just before the school comes into view, and if a car is going above the speed limit, little time is afforded to slow down before reaching the crosswalk.

We strongly urge you to take note of this very important matter before a serious accident occurs at the school. A blinking light is definitely needed. We hope you agree.
