


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, upon passage, copies of this resolution be sent to the Traffic Engineer and the Director of the Department of Public Works.

The following memos are Responses to resolutions 1 through 9 to be heard at 10/2/17 Public Works Committee Meeting

3. Resolution Requesting the Director of the Department of Public Works develop Traffic Calming Measure on Seamans Street.

Response: We have included this location on our list of traffic calming requests to be reviewed by the Traffic Calming Advisory Group (TCAG). Currently we have a plan to review and respond to these requests by the end of the spring of next year. The plan involves increasing the amount of traffic and speed counts performed utilizing the soon to be deployed speed camera.
