ORDINANCE SECOND READING

The following Ordinance was in City Council May 19, 1983, Read and Passed the First Time and is Returned for Passage the Second time:

An Ordinance in Amendment of and In Addition to Article III of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence by Adding Section 17-70 to be Entitled: "Assignment of Police Officers to Construction Projects".

Section 1. Article III of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by adding the following:

Sec. 17-70. Assignment of Police Officers to Construction Projects.

Be It Ordained by the City of Providence:

The Chief of Police shall have the power and authority to assign police officers to any road construction projects within the City of Providence when it is determined by him that such an assignment is necessary for the public safety.

The officers so assigned will be paid for such duty by the contractor in accordance with the schedule of charges in effect by the City of Providence.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.
