

Dear Sir:

I am privileged to submit this summary of activities and accomplishments of the Providence Police Department for 1969. While I must report an increase in Part I offenses of 5.6% over 1968, some measure of satisfaction may be derived from the fact that this is well below the national average of 11% increase for the same period.

The percentage of crimes cleared for the year of 1969 was 28.7%, a substantial increase over the 1968 rate of 24.5%. Demands for police services increased from 75,712 in 1968 to a new high of 78,352 in 1969. Traffic fatalities showed a decrease of 33% for the past year. I feel this decrease can be attributed in great part to the increased vigilance on the part of the officers on the street and the inauguration of radar patrol throughout the city.

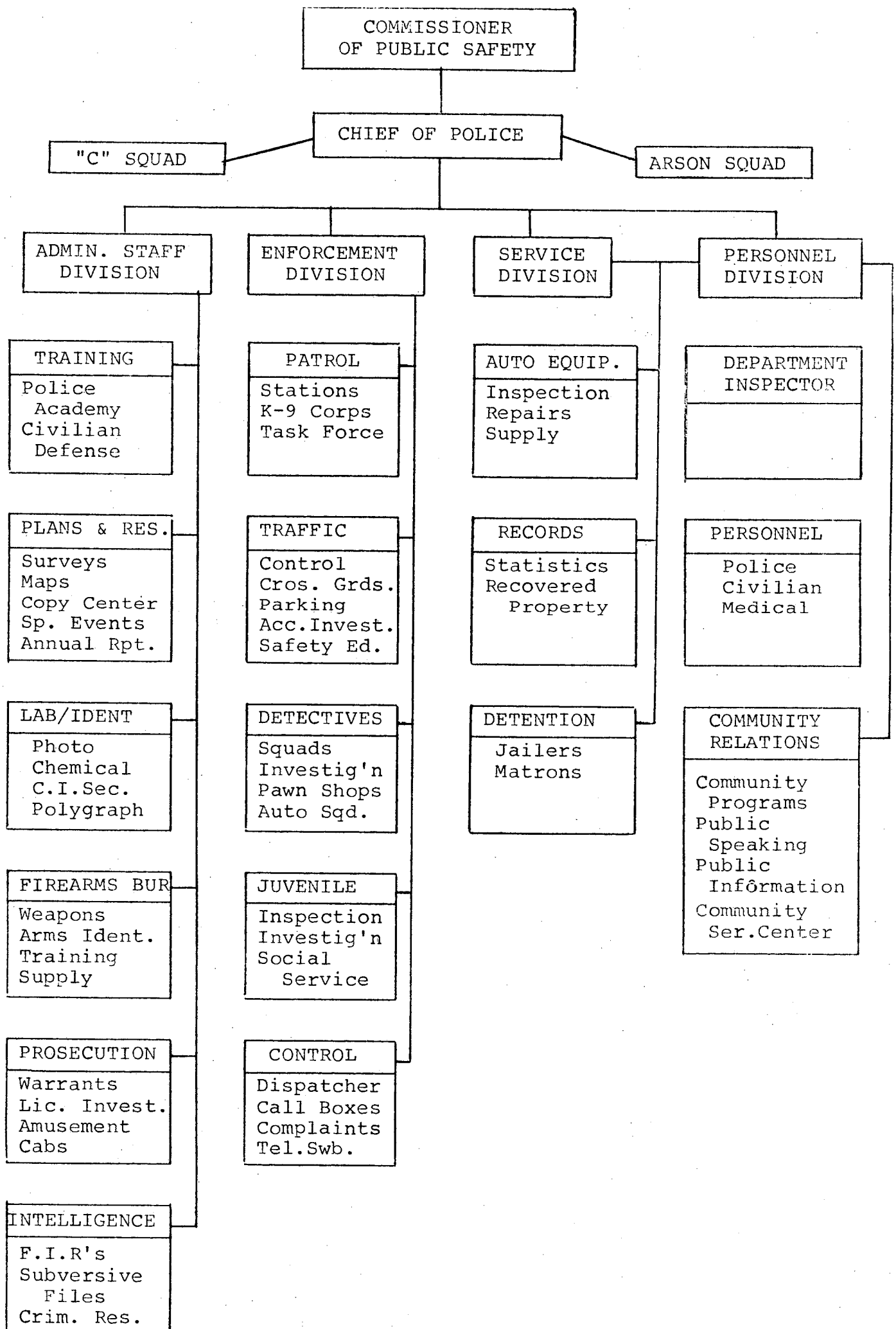
We are continuing to apply for all benefits being offered to law enforcement agencies by the Federal Government. During the past year this department, utilizing Federal Funds, inaugurated a very successful Community Service Officer Program in the South Providence area and we are in the process of expanding this program to other sections of the city. Under the Federal Highway Safety Act we have secured for the Traffic Division a radar unit, portable radios, and other miscellaneous equipment. Our new Control Center, made possible by joint financing between the city and the Federal Government, will be operational in the very near future.

With the acquisition of the modern communication equipment I feel sure that the officers and men will find new pride in the Department and manifest a renewed dedication to the Citizens of the City of Providence.

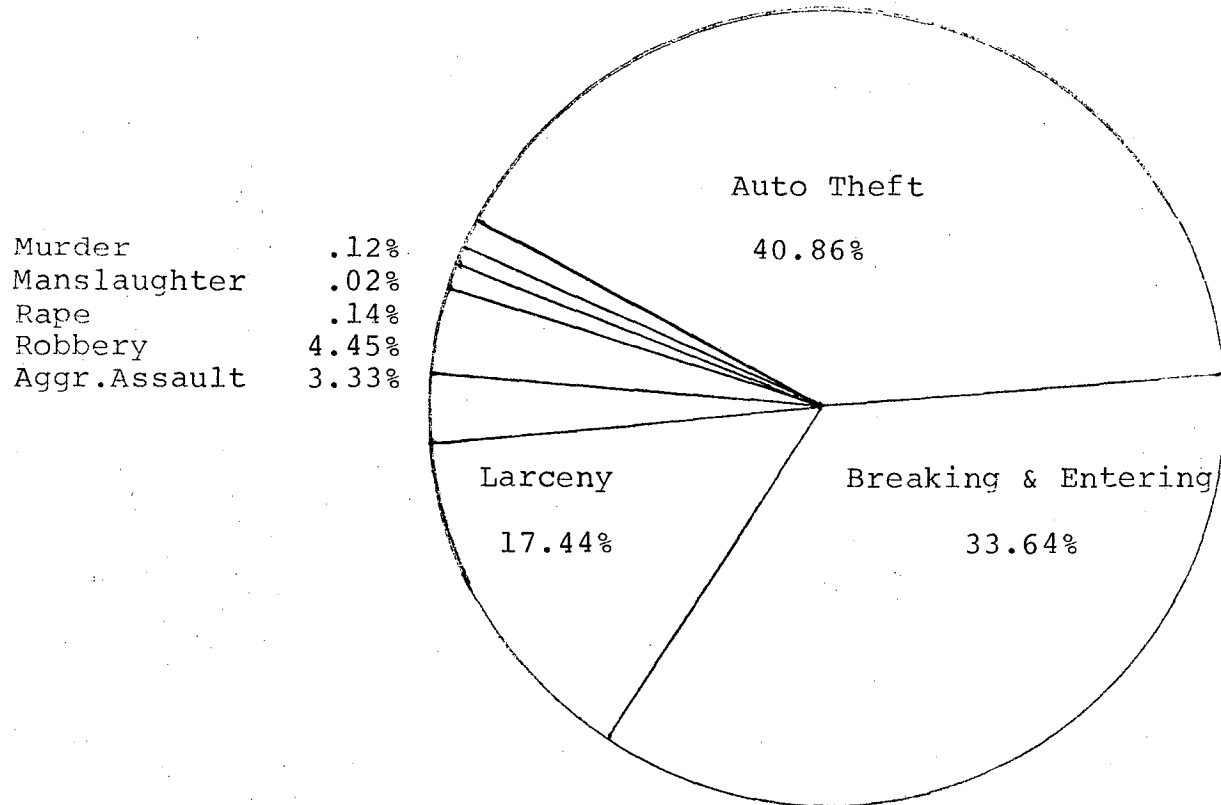

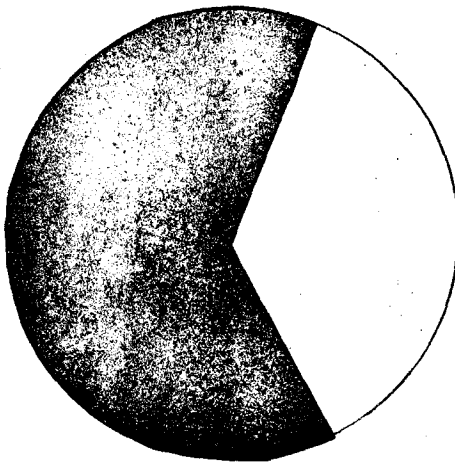

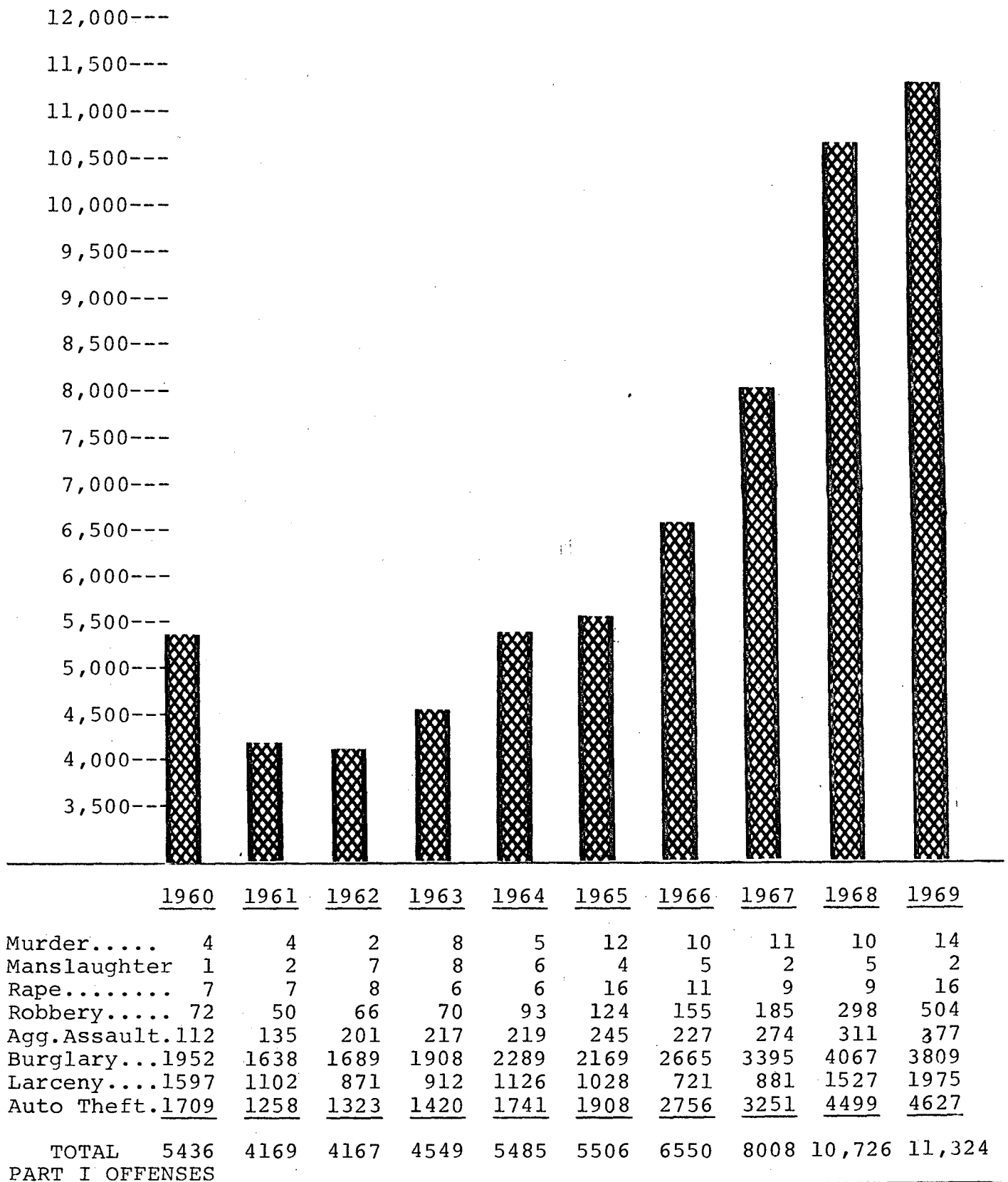

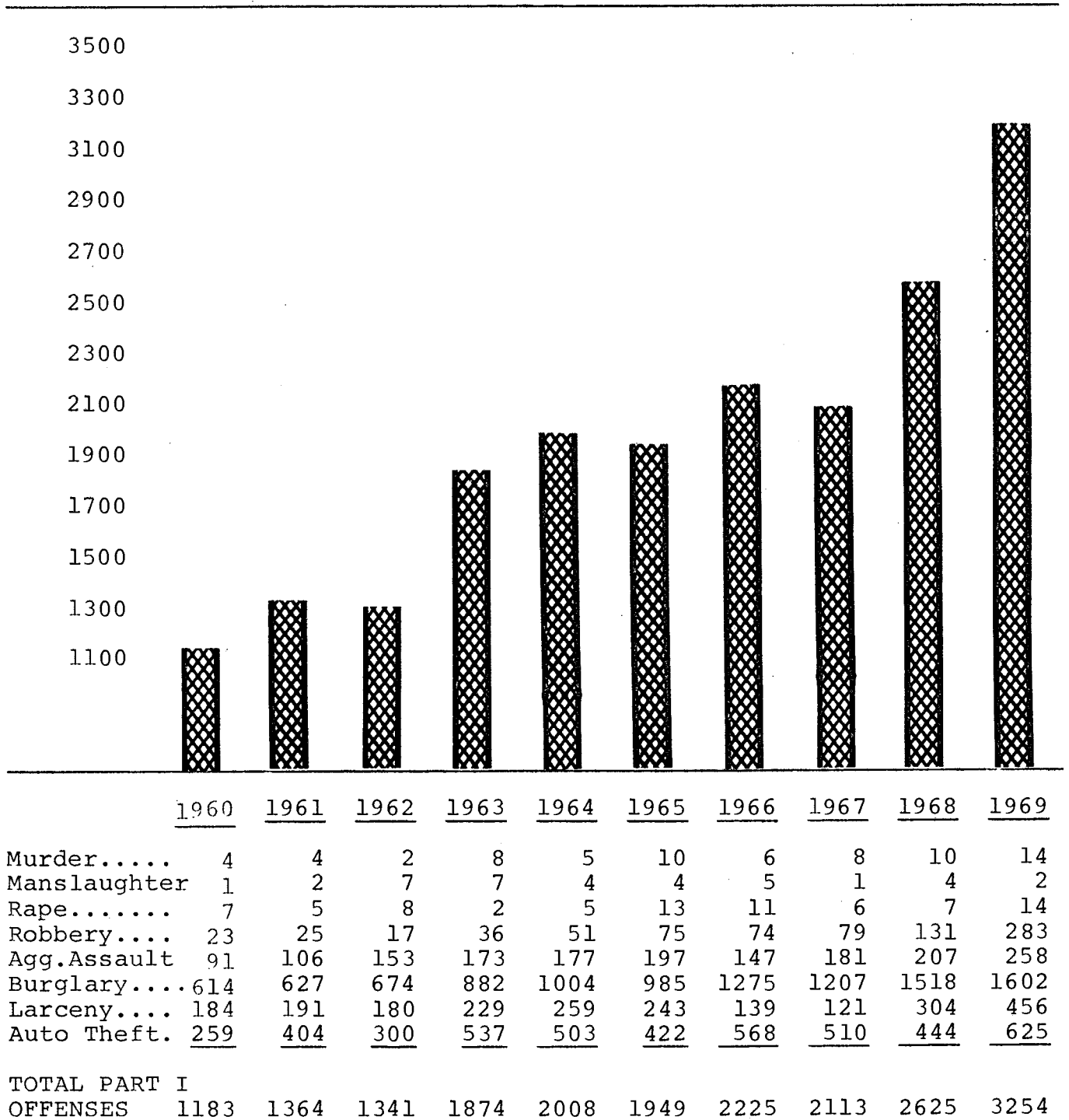

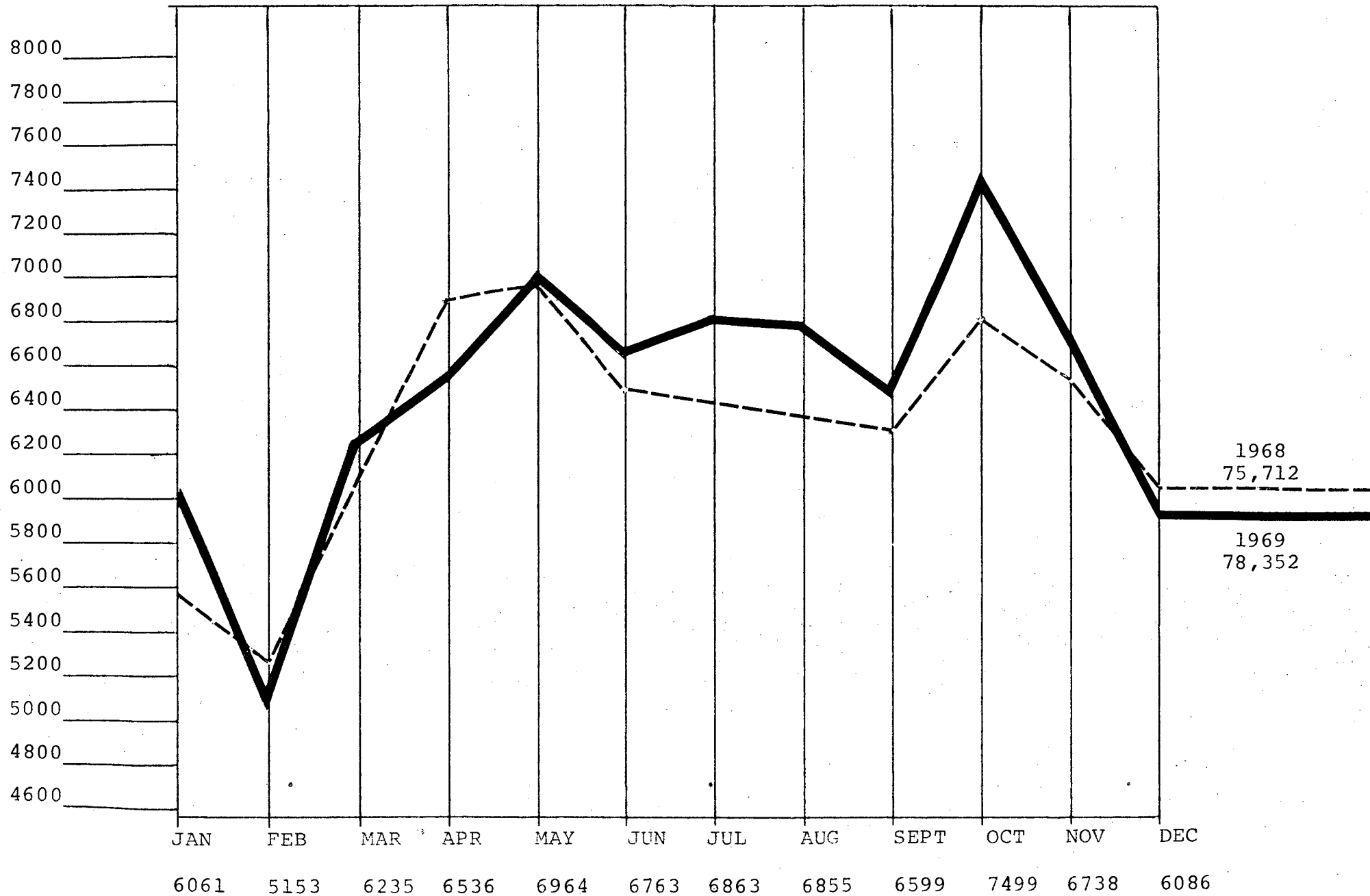
PART I OFFENSES 1960-1969

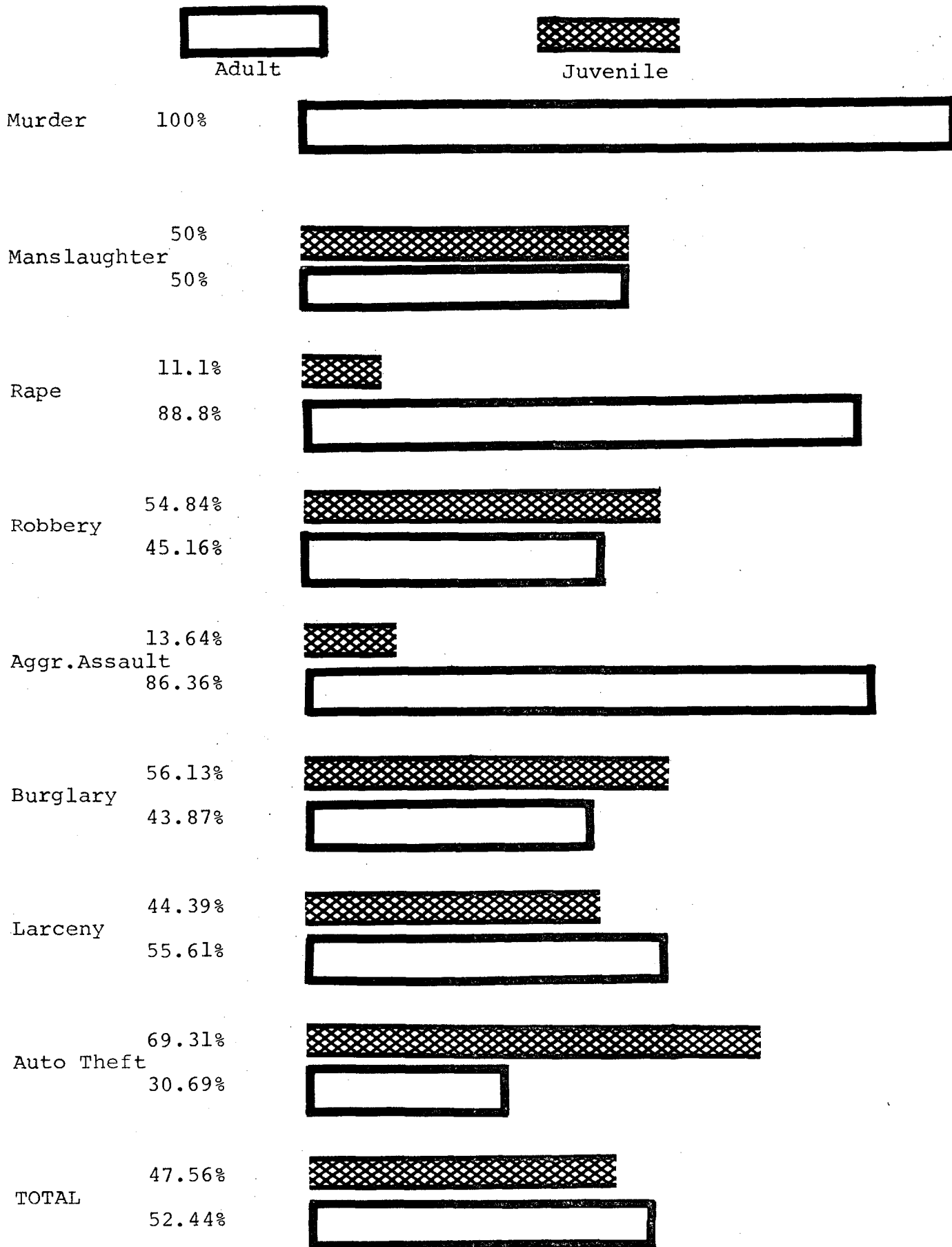

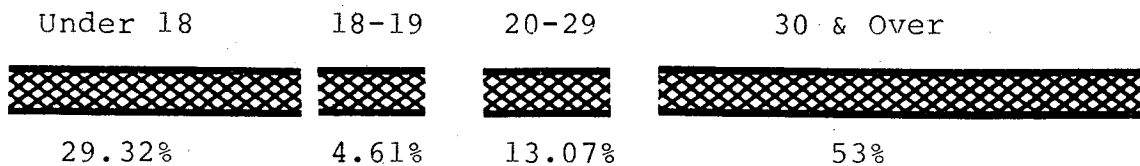
ADULT-JUVENILE ARRESTS FOR PART I OFFENSES IN PROVIDENCE IN 1969



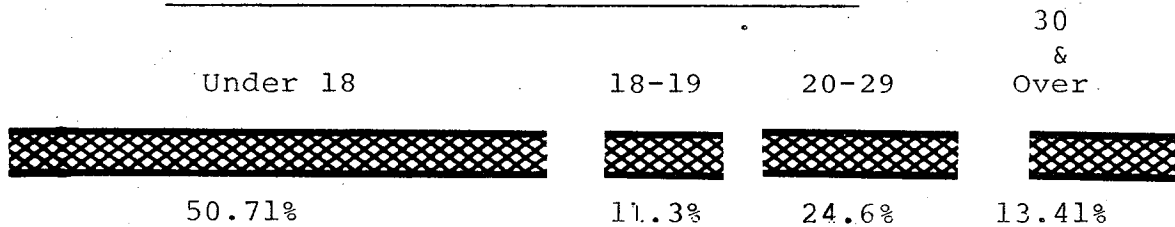
COMPARISON OF POPULATION AGE GROUPS TO ARREST AGE GROUPS

"Special Census of Rhode Island, October, 1965"

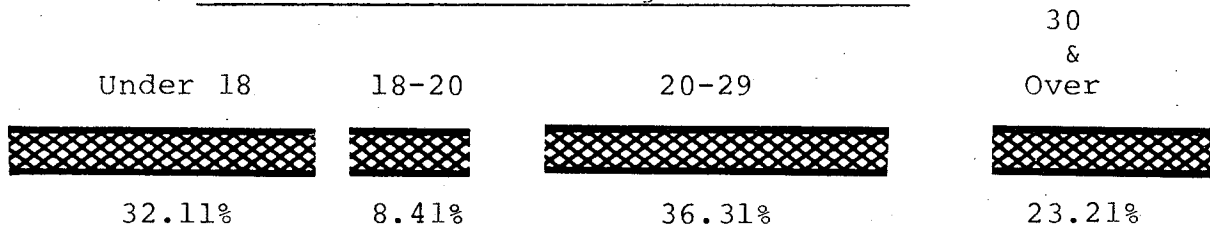
Providence Population by Age Groups



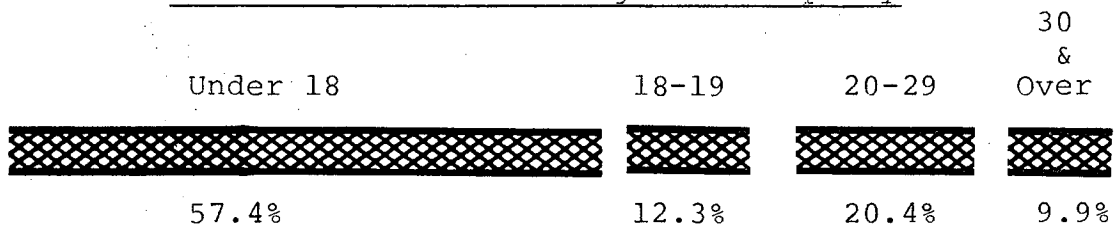
Persons Arrested for Part I Offenses
