

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 162

Approved February 20, 1967

WHEREAS, John E. Fogarty, late, Representative in the Congress of the United States of America from the Second District for the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations had, during his entire congressional tenure, maintained a suite of offices in the downtown section of the City of Providence, rendering service to his constituents in particular and to all in general who sought his assistance, and

WHEREAS, it is therefore fitting and proper, in the opinion of His Honor Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr. and of the Members of the City Council of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, that a memorial in honor of the memory of the late Congressman Fogarty be designated within proximity of that office.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the intersection of Westminster, Weybosset and Exchange Streets be and is designated as "John E. Fogarty Memorial Plaza", shown as shaded area and designated by the letters A-B-C-D-E-F-G-A on the accompanying plan entitled, "Providence, R. I., P. W. Dept.-Engineering Office, Street Line Section, Plan No. 063063, Date February 13, 1967", bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the southeasterly corner of Weybosset and Exchange Streets; thence westerly, crossing Weybosset Street to the tangent point of a curve in the westerly line of Weybosset Street; thence generally westerly in the arc of said curve to the tangent point of said curve in the southeasterly line of Westminster Street; thence north-westerly crossing Westminster Street to a point in the northwesterly line of Westminster Street; thence northeasterly along said northwesterly line of Westminster Street, crossing Exchange Street, to a point square opposite the intersection of the southeasterly line of Westminster Street and the easterly line of Weybosset Street; thence southeasterly crossing Westminster Street to said intersection of the southeasterly line of Westminster Street and the easterly line of Weybosset Street; thence southerly along the easterly line of Weybosset Street, crossing Exchange Street, to the southeasterly corner of Weybosset and Exchange Streets and the point and place of beginning; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to change the designation of Westminster and Weybosset Streets which are hereby declared to continue in and through said designated area, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the official dedication of said "John E. Fogarty Memorial Plaza" be held on March 23, 1967 the anniversary of his birth.

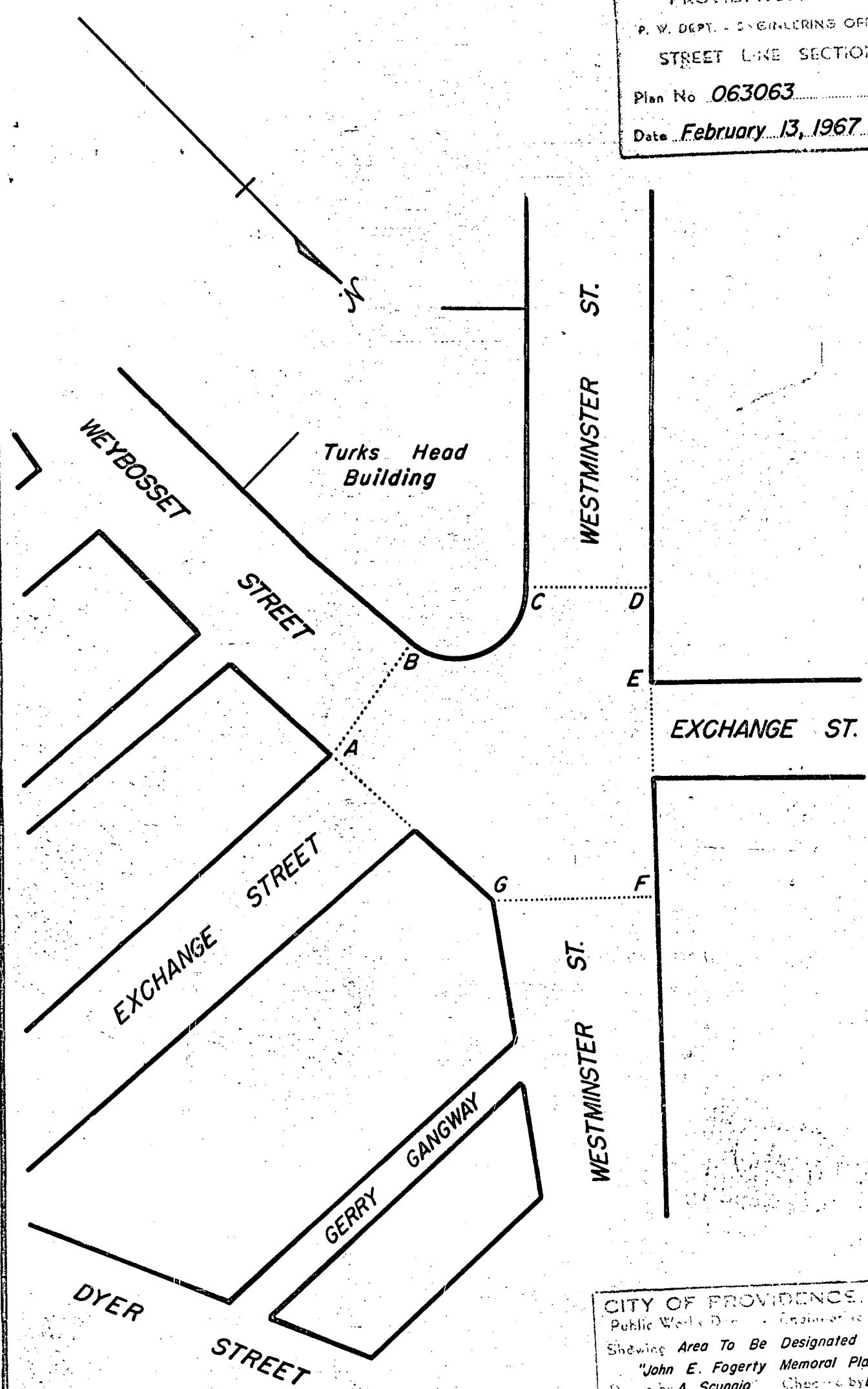

AN ACT

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ISSUE BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$500,000) DOLLARS FOR THE RENOVATION, IMPROVEMENT, ENLARGEMENT, AND RELOCATION OF EXISTING LIBRARY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES OF THE PROVIDENCE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. The city of Providence is hereby authorized and empowered, in addition to and not in substitution for authority previously granted, to issue, in addition to the bonds heretofore issued and now outstanding, under its corporate name and seal or a facsimile of such seal, serial bonds in any form which the city council of said city has heretofore approved or may approve, in an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand (\$500,000) dollars. The principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America, which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts, and the debts incurred by said bonds shall be obligatory on said city in the same manner and to the same extent as other debts lawfully contracted by said city. The dates of maturity of said bonds shall, in no case, be more than twenty-five (25) years after date of issue; provided, however, that the first installment of the principal of the bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall mature on such date as said city council shall determine, but not later than five (5) years after the date of issuance. No installment of principal of any issue shall exceed the next prior installment by more than fifty per cent, except for a prior installment earlier than herein required.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the city treasurer and

countersigned by the mayor of the city of Providence and shall be issued and sold at such times and in such amounts as the city council of said city shall determine. The bonds may be issued in coupon or registered form and shall be subject to such provisions for registration and exchange as may be determined by the city council. The premiums, if any, arising from the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the cost of preparing, issuing and marketing the bonds, and any balance of such premiums shall be applied to the payment of the principal of said bonds in the order of their maturity. The proceeds arising from the sale of the bonds authorized by this act shall be delivered to the city treasurer and such proceeds, except as hereinbefore provided in respect to the premiums arising from the sale thereof, shall be expended for the purpose of the renovation, improvement, enlargement, and relocation of existing library buildings and facilities of the Providence Public Library. No purchaser of any of said bonds, however, shall be in any way responsible for the proper application of the proceeds derived from the sale thereof. The countersignature of the mayor may be by facsimile signature.

SEC. 3. Any proceeds of bonds or notes issued hereunder or of any applicable federal assistance, pending their expenditure, may be deposited or invested by the city treasurer in demand deposits, time deposits or savings deposits in banks which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (without regard to the limit of insurance) or in obligations issued or guaranteed by the United States of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof or by the state of Rhode Island or as may be provided in any other applicable law of the state of Rhode Island.

SEC. 4. The city of Providence shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the interest upon the bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this act and also to pay the principal of the bonds maturing in any such year until said bonds are paid in full. All obligations of said city which are incurred under authority of this act shall be excepted from the operation of section 45-12-2 of the general laws of 1956, as amended.

SEC. 5. The city of Providence, acting by resolution of the city council, is authorized to apply for, contract for and expend any federal survey or planning advances or other grants or assistance which may be available for the purposes of this act. To the extent of any inconsistency between this act or any other law of this state and any applicable federal law or regulation, the latter shall prevail. Federal survey or planning advances, with interest where applicable, whether contracted for prior to or after the effective date of this act, may be repaid as a cost of the project under section 2 of this act.

SEC. 6. The question of the approval of this act shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Providence at a special city election to be held March 26, 1967, notwithstanding that the voters in the eighth through twenty-fifth Representative Districts inclusive will also be participating in the election of a representative in Congress from the Second Congressional District on that day. The polling places shall be designated by the local board as defined in Section 17-1-2 of the General Laws, except that such board shall not have the power conferred by Section 17-11-1.1 of the General Laws, and the election shall be held in conformity with the election laws of the state. The question shall be submitted in substantially the following form: "Shall an act, passed at the January 1967 session of the general assembly, entitled 'An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Issue Bonds in the Amount of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000) Dollars for the Renovation, Improvement, Enlargement, and Relocation of Existing Library Buildings and Facilities of the Providence Public Library', be approved?" Sections 5(a) and 195 of chapter 332 of the public laws of 1940, as amended by chapter 1266 of the public laws of 1943, and chapter 9540 of the public laws of 1955 shall not apply to the election hereunder and the validity of the election shall not be affected by the provisions of section 195 of chapter 2 of the revised ordinances of the city of Providence, 1946, as amended.

SEC. 7. This section and section 5 of this act shall take effect upon the passage of this act. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon the approval of this act by a majority of those voting on the question at the election prescribed by section 6 hereof.
