I am hereby requesting that you submit a resolution to the Council for the installation of 5 new floodlights on Gordon and Reynolds avenues. There are numerous security-related concerns and issues in the area, and the extra lighting will help address the problems.

Specifically, we would like to have these floodlights mounted on pole #2 on Gordon Avenue, and poles #10, 11 and 12 on Reynolds Avenue. These poles are immediately adjacent to our renovation project at 17 Gordon Avenue. The extra lighting will be invaluable – both during and after construction (this proved to be the case for the 570 Broad project).

The Narragansett Electric Company will install the lights for us on their poles, and will request the resolution in order for the lights to be on the City's meter/account.

You know only too well the problems we need to get under control if the Gordon Avenue Environmental Business Incubator project is to be a success. As always, your support and cooperation is deeply appreciated.
