Dear Sir:

It is with pride and honor that I submit for your consideration the 1971 Annual Report of the Providence Police Department. The report is a computation of certain events reduced to numbers and graphs designed primarily for the use of persons concerned with the administration of justice. Statistically the numbers and graphs indicate progress and accomplishments of the Department but, they also show that realistically the number of people effected by crime does not permit us to relax in our enforcement efforts.

1971 was a year of reorganization and revitalization in which the energies of the Department were directed toward improved police service and a high order of public safety with particular emphasis placed on efforts to reduce crime in the streets. Awareness of new and more complex problems in law enforcement, in addition to the growing demands for the traditional services, stressed the necessity for consistently improving police performance.

New concepts of police operations and administration were effected through the cooperation of your office and the city administration. These new concepts and the innovative programs directed at street crimes at the time and place of their most frequent occurrence were translated into improved police service for the people of Providence, not only in the attack on crime, but also in the preservation of peace on the streets of the city.

We are continuing to use every available method to provide the best possible safety for the people we serve. In 1971 we saw the rate of crime increase drop consistently month after month from the 49.9% increase in January to 8% by the end of the year. At the same time we were encouraged to see the clearance rate for serious crimes increase from 26.2% in 1970 to 32.4% for 1971.

Our goals in 1972 will include the continued downward trend in the number of serious crimes and an upward trend in the clearance rate for these crimes. The Providence Police Department shall continue to be dynamic, responsive to new ideas and, hopefully, increasingly successful in the year ahead.



UNIFORM CRIME CLASSIFICATION



CLEARANCE OF PART 1 OFFENSES REPORTED TO THE POLICE







ADULT-JUVENILE ARRESTS FOR PART 1 OFFENSES IN PROVIDENCE IN 1971




COMPARISON OF POPULATION AGE GROUPS TO AGE GROUPS


PROVIDENCE POPULATION BY AGE GROUPS*




PERSONS ARRESTED FOR PART 1 OFFENSES
