





Dear Ms. Testa:

The Department of Residential Life has requested the following **"NO PARKING-EMERGENCY TOW ZONE"** and a **"ONE WAY TRAFFIC PATTERN"**. A major summer building renovation has been completed and will require moving furniture back into buildings in a short period of time. These moves are scheduled to take place between Tuesday, August 20, 1996 through Friday, August 23, 1996. Therefore we are requesting the following action be taken:

**August 20-21 - signage "NO PARKING-EMERGENCY TOW ZONE"**

Brown Street - On Brown St. from George St. to Benevolent St. (east side)

**August 23-24 - signage "NO PARKING-EMERGENCY TOW ZONE"**

Brown Street (east side) from George Street to Benevolent Street. George Street (south side) from Brown Street to Thayer Street.

In addition to the above we are requesting a one-day, one way traffic pattern be established on August 23, 1996:

1. Wriston Quad:
  - a) George Street one way from Brown to Thayer Street.
  - b) Charlesfield Street one way from Thayer to Brown Street.
  - c) Brown Street one way north from Charlesfield to George Street.

**This one way traffic pattern should be established by 6:00am on August 23, 1996 and continue until 7:00pm August 23, 1996.**

We will have a Providence detail officer assigned to this location from 7:00am to 7:00pm to assist with the one way pattern.

Dear Mr. Clarkin:

The Freshman Orientation Program at Brown University begins on Tuesday, August 27, 1996 and ends with the Opening Convocation on Tuesday, September 3, 1996 the first day of classes.

**August 27-28, 1996**

With the majority of student arriving on August 27-28, I am requesting approval for the following traffic pattern on those dates to deal with congestion around the University area:

1. Wriston-Keeney Quad areas:
  - a) George Street one-way east from Brown Street to Thayer Street.
  - b) Charlesfield Street one-way west from Thayer to Brown Street.
  - c) Benevolent Street one-way east from Magee to Brown Street.
  - d) Brown Street one-way north from Charlesfield to George Street.
  - e) Post and enforce "NO PARKING" on the west side of Magee Street from George to Benevolent St.
2. Pembroke Area:
  - a) Post south side of Bowen Street from Thayer to Brown Street "NO PARKING ANYTIME".

This traffic pattern should be established by 6:00am, on August 27, 1996 and end by 6:00pm on August 28, 1996. We will have a Providence Police detail at control points in addition to our Brown University Officers, from 7:00am to 6:00pm on August 27 and 28. Additionally, I would request that parking restriction/tagging be lifted on most streets adjacent to the campus during this two day period.

September 3, 1996


On Tuesday, September 3, 1996 the Opening Convocation will be held. In order to facilitate the safe movement of students on College Street from Benefit Street east through the Van Wickle Gates onto the College Green, I am requesting permission to block off vehicular traffic to the following streets between 10:45am and 11:45am on that date only:

1. College Street from Benefit east to the Van Wickle Gates at Prospect Street.
2. Prospect Street from Waterman to George Street.

Again, police officers from our Department would work control points to handle traffic.
