A N A C T

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ISSUE BONDS
ON THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$500,000)
DOLLARS FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Section 1. The city of Providence is hereby authorized and empowered, in addition to and not in substitution for authority previously granted, to issue, in addition to the bonds heretofore issued and now outstanding, under its corporate name and seal, serial bonds in any form which the city council of said city may approve, in a sum not exceeding five hundred thousand (\$500,000) dollars. Said bonds shall be of any denomination not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars each, the principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts and the debts incurred by said bonds shall be obligatory on said city in the same manner and to the same extent as other debts lawfully contracted by said city. The dates of maturity of said bonds shall in no case be more than twenty-five (25) years after date of issue; provided, however, that the first installment of the principal of the bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall mature on such date as said city council shall determine, but no later than five (5) years after the date of issuance.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the city treasurer and countersigned by the mayor of the city of Providence and shall be issued and sold at such times and in such amounts as the city council of said city shall determine; provided, however, that the premiums, if any, arising from the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the payment of the principal of said bonds in the

order of their maturity. The proceeds arising from the sale of the bonds authorized by this act shall be delivered to the city treasurer, and such proceeds, except as hereinbefore provided in respect to the premium arising from the sale thereof, shall be expended for the purpose of constructing and repairing such highways in the city of Providence as said city council may determine, including the acquisition of land in said city of Providence for highway purposes. No purchaser of any of said bonds, however, shall be in any way responsible for the proper application of the proceeds derived from the same thereof. The countersignature of the mayor may be by facsimile signature.

Sec. 3. The city of Providence shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the interest upon the bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this act, and also to pay the principal of the bonds maturing in any such year, until said bonds are paid in full. All obligations of said city, which are incurred under authority of this act shall be excepted from the operation of section 45-12-2 of the general laws of 1916, but shall be subject to the provisions of section 135 of chapter 332 of the public laws of 1919, as amended by chapter 1266 of the public laws of 1932.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ISSUE BONDS
TO THE SUM OF ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND
(\$1,200,000) DOLLARS FOR REPAIR, MAINTENANCE,
REPLACEMENT AND RECONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly:

Section 1. The city of Providence is hereby authorized and empowered, in addition to and not in substitution for authority previously granted, to issue, in addition to the bonds heretofore issued and now outstanding, under its corporate name and seal, serial bonds in any form which the city council of said city may approve, in a sum not exceeding one million two hundred thousand (\$1,200,000) dollars. Said bonds shall be of any denomination not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars each, the principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America, which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts and the debts incurred by said bonds shall be obligatory on said city in the same manner and to the same extent as other debts lawfully contracted by said city. The dates of maturity of said bonds shall in no case be more than twenty-five (25) years after date of issue; provided, however, that the first installment of the principal of the bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall mature on such date as said city council shall determine, but no later than five (5) years after the date of issuance.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the city treasurer and countersigned by the mayor of the city of Providence and shall be issued and sold at such times and in such amounts as the city council of said city shall determine; provided, however, that the premium, if any, arising from the sale of said

bonds shall be applied to the payment of the principal of said bonds in the order of their maturity. No purchaser of any of said bonds, however, shall be in any way responsible for the proper application of the proceeds derived from the sale thereof. The countersignature of the mayor may be by facsimile signature.

Sec. 3. The city of Providence shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the interest upon the bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this act, and also to pay the principal of the bonds maturing in any such year, until said bonds are paid in full. All obligations of said city which are incurred under authority of this act shall be excepted from the operation of section 45-12-2 of the general laws of 1956, but shall be subject to the provisions of section 195 of chapter 892 of the public laws of 1940 as amended by chapter 1266 of the public laws of 1943.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO ISSUE
BONDS IN THE SUM OF FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND
(\$400,000) DOLLARS FOR THE MAINTENANCE,
REPAIR and MODERNIZATION OF PUBLIC WORKS--
SANITATION DIVISION BUILDINGS and EQUIPMENT**

Section 1. The city of Providence is hereby authorized and empowered, in addition to and not in substitution for authority previously granted, to issue, in addition to the bonds heretofore issued and now outstanding, under its corporate name and seal, serial bonds in any form which the city council of said city may approve, in a sum not exceeding four hundred thousand (\$400,000) dollars. Said bonds shall be of any denomination not exceeding twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars each, the principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America, which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts and the debts incurred by said bonds shall be obligatory on said city in the same manner and to the same extent as other debts lawfully contracted by said city. The dates of maturity of said bonds shall in no case be more than twenty-five (25) years after date of issue; provided, however, that the first installment of the principal of the bonds issued under the provisions of this act shall mature on such date as said city council shall determine, but no later than five (5) years after the date of issuance.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the city treasurer and countersigned by the mayor of the city of Providence and shall be issued and sold at such times and in such amounts as the city council of said city shall determine; provided, however, that the premiums, if any, arising from the sale of said

bonds shall be applied to the payment of the principal of said bonds in the order of their maturity. The proceeds arising from the sale of the bonds authorized by this act shall be delivered to the city treasurer, and such proceeds, except as hereinbefore provided in respect to the premiums arising from the sale thereof, shall be expended for the maintenance, repair and modernization of buildings and equipment under the control of the Public Works--Sanitation Division. No purchaser of any of said bonds, however, shall be in any way responsible for the proper application of the proceeds derived from the sale thereof. The countersignature of the mayor may be by facsimile signature.

Sec. 3. The city of Providence shall annually appropriate a sum sufficient to pay the interest upon the bonds issued and outstanding under the authority of this act, and also to pay the principal of the bonds maturing in any such year, until said bonds are paid in full. All obligations of said city which are incurred under authority of this act shall be excepted from the operation of section 49-13-2 of the general laws of 1956, but shall be subject to the provisions of section 139 of chapter 632 of the public laws of 1949, as amended by chapter 1266 of the public laws of 1949.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, recent studies and reports by authoritative medical and scientific groups have indicated conclusively that cigarette smoking does have serious harmful effects upon humans' health, and

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking by minors is especially undesirable, which fact was long ago recognized by the General Assembly as early as 1896, and

WHEREAS, over the years enforcement of laws forbidding the sale of cigarettes to minors under sixteen years of age and the use in Public by such minors of tobacco products has waned so that today both sellers of tobacco products and minors under sixteen years of age and the general public are not fully aware of these laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Commissioner of Public Safety take the necessary steps to inform vendors of tobacco products of the provisions of Chapter 11-9-13, which makes ^{it a} criminal offense to sell, give or deliver cigarettes to a minor under sixteen years of age, and of Chapter 11-9-14, which makes it an offense by a minor under sixteen years of age to use tobacco in any form in a public place, ^{and v.} to call upon said vendors to comply with said laws and thereafter to enforce the same.

WHEREAS, there is presently in the State of Rhode Island, forty (40) Governmental Units, including the State Government and also a multiplicity of other Agencies performing services customarily provided by Governmental Units and exercising Governmental powers, and

WHEREAS, substantial efficiency in operation and great savings in public funds might be effected if cities and towns could enter into contracts with each other or with the State for the performance of services or the provision of new services, both Governmental and Proprietary for each other and also for the consolidation of functions,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the General Assembly be requested to enact a General Enabling Act, pursuant to which cities and towns would be authorized to enter into written contracts with each other or with the State for the performance of service, both Governmental and Proprietary, for each other and for the consolidation of functions upon such considerations, terms, and conditions and through such agencies as may be mutually agreed upon; said Act to provide among other things, that said contracts are to be duly authorized by the vote of the Financial Town Meeting, or the Legislative Body of such Municipalities, as may be empowered to appropriate and expend money for the General Public Welfare, and by the General Assembly in behalf of the State. Such contracts shall be signed by such officials authorized by law to enter into contracts in behalf of such Municipalities and by the Governor in behalf of the State.




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
