AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC LAWS 1959, CHAPTER 131, SECTION 3; GENERAL LAWS 1956, SECTION 45-24.1-3, ENTITLED, "HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION"

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION I. General Laws of the State of Rhode Island 1956 as amended, Section 45-24.1-3 is hereby further amended to read as follows:

In order to carry out the purposes of this chapter the city council of any city or the town council of any town shall have the authority to create a commission to be called the historic district commission. The membership of such a commission in a city shall consist of seven (7) qualified members and in a town shall consist of not less than three (3) nor more than seven (7) qualified members whose residence is located in such city or town, provided that the historic district commission of the city of Providence shall consist of nine (9) qualified members two (2) of whom shall be members of the city council elected by the city council from its councilmatic members to serve for a term ending the first Monday in January, A.D. 1975 and thereafter elected for a term of four (4) years. In a city the members shall be appointed by the mayor, accept as herein before provided in the case of the historic district commission of the city of Providence, and in a town by the president of the town council. The appointed members of such commission shall be appointed for three (3) year terms except the initial appointments of some of the members shall be for less than three (3) years to the end that the initial appointments shall be staggered and so that subsequent appointments shall not reoccur at the same time. Appointed members

of the commission shall be eligible for reappointment. In the event of a vacancy on the commission interim appointments of appointed members, may be made by the appointing authority to complete the unexpired term of such position. Duly organized and existing preservation societies may present to the appointing authority of a city or town a list of qualified citizes from which list the appointing authority may select members of the commission for his respective city or town.

SECTION II. Nothing herein contained shall in any way alter any other part or provision of this Title, Chapter or Section or any appointments heretofor or hereafter made thereunder, all of which remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

IN AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC LAWS 1923, CHAPTER 485, SECTION 1, SECTION 2, AND THE BUILDING CODE 1941, SECTION 128.21 AND SECTION 128.22 ENTITLED, "BUILDING BOARD OF REVIEW"

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 485 of the public laws of 1923 entitled, "An Act authorizing the City of Providence to enact a building ordinance" Section 2, is hereby amended as follows:

Said city council may provide for the selection and organization of a board of review, consisting of seven (7) members; five (5) of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor, and two (2) of whom shall be members of the city council elected by the city council from its councilmatic members to serve for a term ending the first Monday in January, A.D. 1975 and thereafter to be elected for a term of four (4) years. The chairman, or in his absence the acting chairman, may administer oaths and compel the attendance of witnesses. All hearings of such board shall be open to the public.

SECTION II. Nothing herein contained shall in any way alter any other part or provision of this Title, Chapter or Section, or any appointments heretofor or hereafter made thereunder, all of which remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

IN AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC LAWS 1962, CHAPTER 87, SECTION 1, GENERAL LAWS SECTION 45-24-4, CHAPTER 17 A, SECTION 53, ADDED BY ORDINANCE 1956, CHAPTER 1040, SECTION 5, ORDINANCE 1970, ARTICLE III, SECTION 13-59, ENTITLED, "HOUSING BOARD OF REVIEW"

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION I. Rhode Island General Laws Section 45-24.2-5
is hereby amended to read as follows:

The city councils and town councils authorized to adopt standards relating to minimum housing may provide for the selection and organization of a housing board of review consisting of five (5) members. Provided that in the case of the housing board of review of the city of Providence, there shall be seven (7) members, five (5) of whom shall be appointed by the mayor and two (2) of whom shall be members of the city council elected by the city council from its councilmatic members to serve for a term ending the first Monday in January, A.D. 1975 and thereafter to be elected for a term of four (4) years. The city and town councils are authorized to designate the board of appeals as the housing board of review in the cities and towns where such boards of appeal now exist or may hereinafter be authorized by law. The chairman, or in his absence, the acting chairman, may administer oaths and compel the attendance of witnesses. All hearings of such board shall be open to the public. The remaining provisions of this section shall be in full force and effect and are not repealed.

SECTION II. Nothing herein contained shall in any way alter any other part or provision of this Title, Chapter and Section or any appointments heretofore or hereafter made thereunder, all of which remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

IN AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC LAWS 1937, CHAPTER 2553, SECTION 1, ENTITLED,
"COMMISSIONS OF ESTATE OF CHARLES H. SMITH"

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 1736 of the General Laws of Rhode Island 1937, Section 1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

There shall be a board of commissioners of the Estate of Charles H. Smith, consisting of the Mayor of the City of Providence, the Finance Director of the City of Providence and the Superintendant of Parks of said city, all ex officio and six (6) other members, two (2) of whom shall be members of the city council elected by the city council from its councilmatic members to serve for a term ending the first Monday in January, A.D. 1975 and thereafter to be elected for a term of four (4) years.

The present elective members of said board of commissioners, other than the councilmatic members shall hold office for the terms for which they have been elected, and annually on the first Monday in January the city council shall elect one elective member for the term of four (4) years. Said elective members shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified. In case any person elected as a member of said board shall decline to serve or neglect to qualify, or a vacancy among the elective members shall occur for any cause, said office or vacancy shall be filled by the city council for the term of said office or unexpired term; such ex officio members shall receive no further compensation for their services but such other members shall receive such compensation for their

services, as may be fixed by the city council of the City of Providence.

SECTION II. Nothing herein contained shall in any way alter any other part or provision of this Chapter or any appointments heretofor or hereafter made thereunder, all of which remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

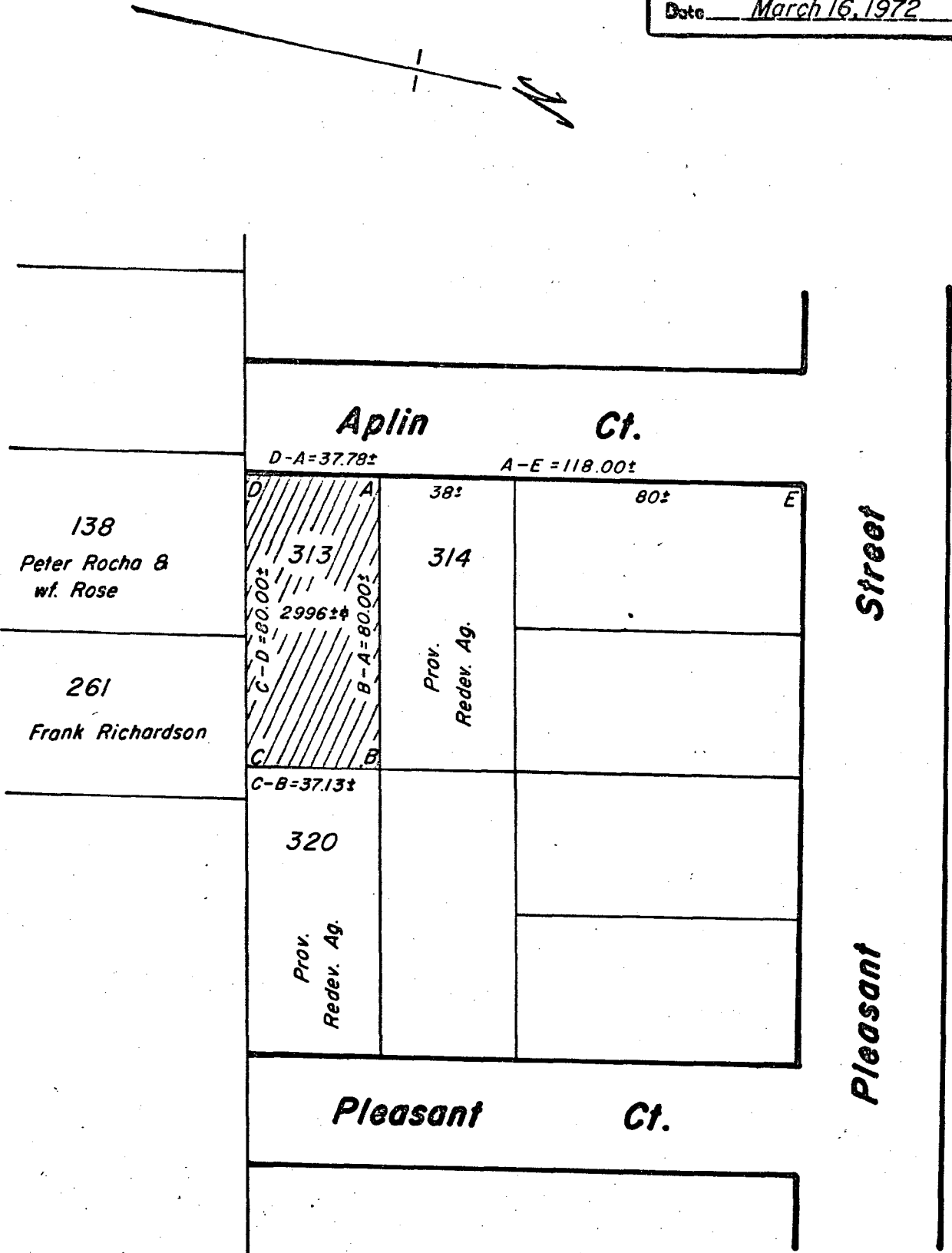




