Resolved,

That the City Treasurer, acting under the direction of the Committee on Finance, be, and he hereby is authorized and directed to borrow from time to time such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$600,000.00) Dollars, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 21 of the Public Laws passed by the General Assembly at its January Session, A. D. 1958, and approved May 20, 1958 entitled "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Issue Bonds in the sum of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$600,000.00) Dollars for Highway Purposes", and to issue the City's notes therefor, signed by him and countersigned by the Mayor and Chairman of Finance Committee; and to renew any such notes from time to time as the same become due. The money thus obtained is hereby appropriated for and shall be exclusively used and expended for the purpose of constructing and repairing such highways in the City of Providence as the City Council may determine, including the acquisition of land in said City of Providence for highway purposes.

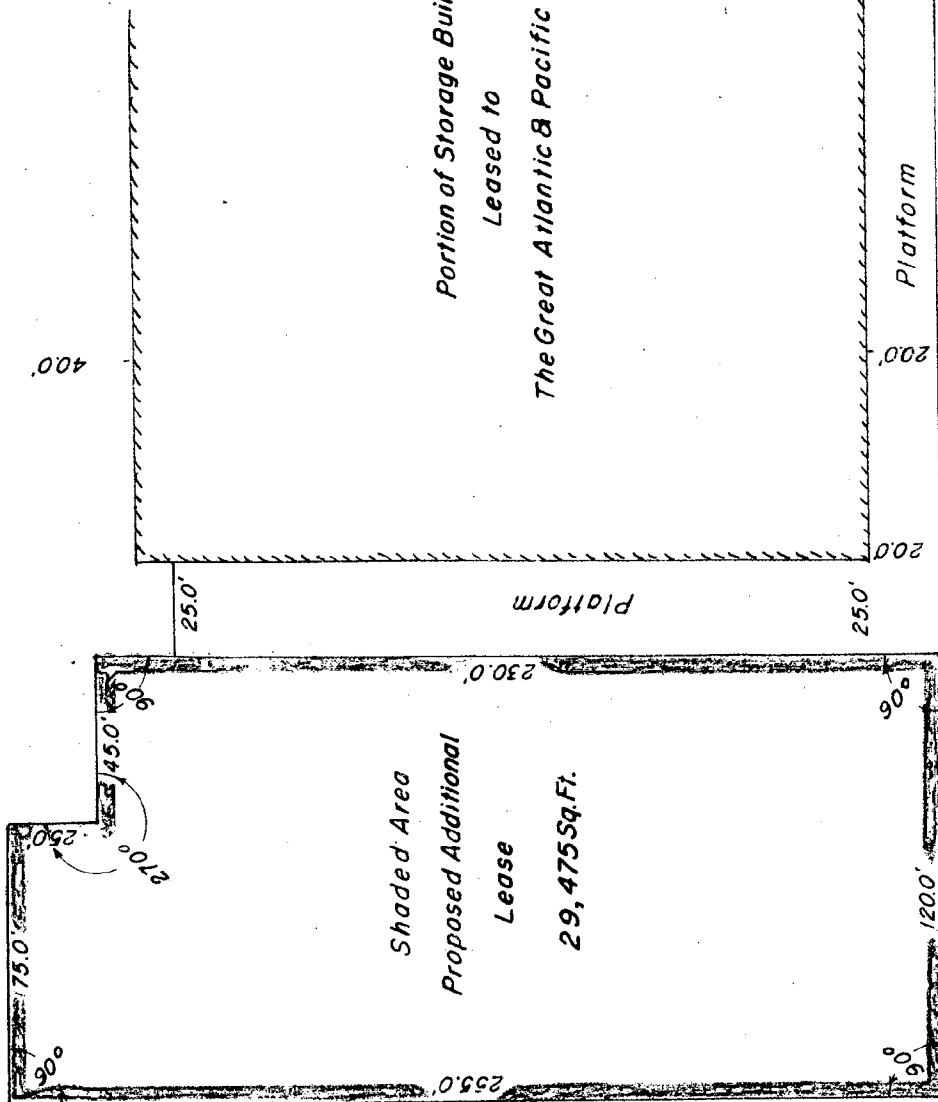

Whereas, it is the policy of the City of Providence to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise; and

WHEREAS, low-rent housing is needed to assist in meeting the housing goal of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, the application of The Housing Authority of the City of Providence, Rhode Island as required by said United States Act, was heretofore approved by the City Council of the City of Providence on September 16, 1949 and April 18, 1957;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Providence as follows:

There still exists in the City of Providence a need for low-rent housing at rents within the means of low-income families.
