




It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 40-13.2-5 of the General Laws in Chapter 40-13.2 entitled
2 "Criminal records check - Employee" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3 40-13.2-5. Criminal records check - Employee. - Any person seeking employment, if
4 that employment involves supervisory or disciplinary power over a child or children or
5 involves routine contact with a child or children without the presence of other employees,
6 in any facility which is, or is required to be, licensed or registered with the department or
7 seeking that employment at the training school for youth shall after acceptance by the
8 employer of the affidavit required by §40-13.2-3, apply to the bureau of criminal
9 identification of the state police or the local police department for a nationwide criminal
10 records check. The check will conform to applicable federal standards including the
11 taking of fingerprints to identify the applicant. Upon the discovery of any disqualifying
12 information as defined in accordance with the rule promulgated by the director, the bureau
13 of criminal identification of the state police or the local police department will inform the
14 applicant in writing of the nature of the disqualifying information. In addition, the bureau
15 of criminal identification of the state police or the local police department will inform the
16 applicant in writing, without disclosing the nature of the disqualifying information that an
17 item of disqualifying information has been discovered. In those situations in which no
18 disqualifying information has been found, the bureau of criminal identification of the state
19 police or the local police department will inform both the applicant and the employer in
20 writing of this fact. The employer will maintain on file, subject to inspection by the
21 department, evidence that criminal records checks have been initiated on all employees
22 seeking employment after August 1, 1985, and the result of the checks. Failure to
23 maintain that evidence on file will be prima facie grounds to revoke the license of
24 registration of the operator of the facility. It will be the responsibility of the bureau of
25 criminal identification of the state police or the local police department to conduct the
26 nationwide criminal records check pursuant to this section. The nationwide criminal
27 record check will be provided to the applicant for employment without charge. for a fee of
28 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

29 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.



