

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved April 20, 1970

WHEREAS, April 22, 1970, is the Five Hundredth and Nineteenth Anniversary of the birth of Queen Isabella, of Castile, Spain, daughter of Juan the Second, Ruler of Castile, Spain, and wife of Ferdinand of Aragon with whom she reigned as Queen of Castile and Lyon, and

WHEREAS, the Daughters of Isabella, founded in the State of Connecticut in 1896 for the purpose of uniting all Roman Catholic women into a fraternal and beneficial society of mutual friendship and to establish a bond of unity in truth and in interest in times of trouble and disasters, and

WHEREAS, as Queen, Isabella who, at the age of twenty-three became the reigning Monarch of her beloved Spain and, for seventeen years, was one of the most influential women of her time who exerted a stabilizing influence over her Kingdom, was a model of virtue, piety and domestic economy, although she suffered from numerous personal tragedies, and

WHEREAS, her foresightedness and vision, far beyond the immediate realities of her time linked her name in history with the discovery of the New World by the Italian Navigator Christopher Columbus,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That His Honor Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., and the Members of the City Council hereby do proclaim April 22, 1970, as "Queen Isabella Day", in memory of and in honor of Queen Isabella of Castile, Spain, founder of the Daughters of Isabella and urge all citizens, schools, historical and other interested organizations to suitably observe this significant event in the history of the World.

PETITION


JOHNSTON SANITARY DISTRICT and respectfully represents as follows:

1. That a written contract exists between the City of Providence and the Johnston Sanitary District whereby the City of Providence agrees to accept domestic sewerage from the Sanitary District upon certain terms and conditions.
2. That Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc. is unable to tie into the sewerage system as its waste is industrial or commercial and not domestic. Further, a health situation exists and the Federal Government is threatening to shut down the operations of Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc., unless it has an adequate waste disposal method.
3. That C. A. McGuire Associates have designed a series of traps to assure against solids or other deleterious materials from entering into the sewerage system.
4. That Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc. agrees to install said system of traps in order to tie into said system and to meet any other reasonable conditions.
5. NOW THEREFORE, THE JOHNSTON SANITARY DISTRICT prays that this Honorable City Council make an exception to the written contract between the parties and permits the Johnston Sanitary District to allow Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc. to tie into the sewerage system and to dispose of its other than domestic waste into said system.

Dear Sir:

The request of the Johnston Sanitary District to allow the Johnston Dressed Beef Company to discharge the processed liquid from their operation into the Johnston Sewers, which in turn discharges into the Providence Sewer Collecting System, is insignificant as far as quantity is concerned (the amount of liquid being 1200 Gals. Per Day). However, taking the wastes from one commercial or industrial plant will open the door for additional non-residential discharges, which without proper safeguards, would increase the peak discharge to a point where the quantity discharged would exceed the capacity of the Providence sewers.

Should the City allow commercial discharge into the sewer system, devices to regulate the rate of flow will be required in each installation.

The type, design, construction and maintenance of these devices shall be as approved by the Director of Public Works of the City of Providence.

Dear Mayor Doorley:

I represent the abovementioned Sewer District and I have been requested to write to you and the Providence City Council on behalf of said District regarding Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc. Copies of two letters are enclosed for your information.

As you know, our sewerage is disposed of by your City at a fixed rate and pursuant to a written contract between the District and said City. In the agreement it provides that Johnston can only dispose of domestic sewerage and Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc., by virtue of the present contract between the parties, is unable to tie into our sewer system because its waste is industrial or commercial and not domestic.

Mr. Walter J. Shea of the State Department of Health is going to shut down the slaughtering operations unless the Beef Co. ties into the sewer system. The District is writing to you and the City Council for permission to allow Johnston Dressed Beef Co., Inc. to dispose of its sewerage into our system and ultimately into yours notwithstanding the provisions of the contract between the parties
