





RE: PROPOSED RESOLUTION

Be advised that traffic regulation matters on State maintained roadways require City Council approval and concurrence from the Chief of Police. Accordingly, since Smith Street is now under State jurisdiction for maintenance, I am at the request of Councilwoman Evelyn Fagnoli asking you to please place the following resolution on the next City Council "docket" as follows:

RESOLVED, That the State of Rhode Island Traffic Commission shall pass regulations and post signs as follows:

1. "NO LEFT TURN" from Smith Street southeasterly bound onto Longwood Avenue.
2. "NO RIGHT TURN" from Smith Street northwesterly bound onto Longwood Avenue.


