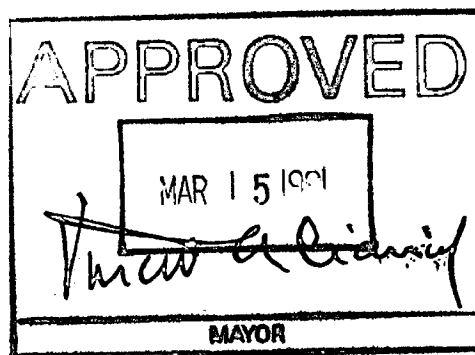

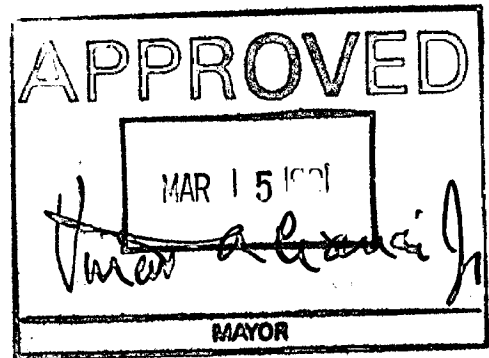

I am writing this at the request of Mrs. Maggie Scott, who said she spoke with you during the last week regarding the following problems.



Our neighborhood, specifically Europe Street, Federal Street, and DePasquale Avenue are having serious problems with garbage, and debris in nearby lots, thereby causing an infestation of rats.

The regular pick-up garbage pick-up is on Friday, but tenants have been putting their garbage out on Saturday and leaving it on the sidewalks all week long. Some of these tenements are six units and the owners either have no dumpster or have had the dumpsters taken away by the company for non-payment.

The tenants and the owners of many of these properties have been cited but have no regard for our code enforcement laws. I would therefore like to ask for your assistance in this matter on behalf of those residents who take pride in their homes and neighborhood.

Dear Sir:

I am writing to you as my representative on the City Council to express my deep concerns for the serious deficiencies in traffic regulation and enforcement in downtown Providence.

I have observed traffic signals including walk signals for pedestrians either not operating properly or not operating at all.

I have observed motor vehicles speeding especially on Empire Street, without apprehension by the Police.

I have observed motor vehicles when the traffic signal is green not yielding the right-of-way to pedestrians who may be crossing when the light changes, without apprehension by the Police. This is prevalent at the intersections of Washington and Empire Streets, and of Washington and Greene Streets.

I have observed motor vehicles making a turn on green not granting the right-of-way to pedestrians crossing on green, without apprehension by the Police. This is prevalent at the intersections of Washington and Empire Streets, and of Washington and Greene Streets.

Unless these deficiencies are corrected, pedestrians especially the elderly like myself will be vulnerable to serious injury when crossing streets.

I would be very grateful if this matter is given your attention.
