Administrator of Workforce Solutions of Providence/Cranston (WSPC) the designated intermediary for all federal and state funding for local employment and training programs which serve the residents and businesses in the cities of Providence and Cranston. Directed by a business-led Workforce Investment Board appointed by the Mayor of Providence, WSPC also coordinates the employment and training efforts of netWORKri, the state's largest one-stop career center. Position oversees the management and operation of all programs for the Providence/Cranston Workforce Investment Area. Responsible for a \$9.5 million annual budget, and 26 workforce development staff. Position serves as Chief Executive to the Workforce Investment Board and its committees.

Highlights of key accomplishments:

- Consistently met all seventeen performance standards set by the federal government including job placements, average wages earned, job retention and customer and employee satisfaction standards.
- Directed the preparation of a technology training grant application that resulted in the award of a \$7.5 million "H-1-B, Ready to Work Program".
- Established the Providence Skills Center, at the Providence Place Mall, the first retail training program in New England accredited by National Retail Federation Association.
- Established with CVS, an accredited Pharmacy Technician Program at the Providence Skills Center.
- Oversaw the successful development of the Youth Center Model pilot, ultimately adopted statewide and funded with Rhode Island Job Development and Federal funds.
- Oversaw the establishment of the Mayor's Industry Sector Job Fairs. Since 2011, 40 job fairs have been held serving 250 employers and 10,000 job seekers.
