ELECTION OF JUDGE OF PROBATE COURT OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE

The City Council proceeds to elect a Judge of Probate Court in accordance with the provisions of Section XI of Chapter 3340 of the Public Laws of 1954, approved April 26, 1954, entitled, "An Act in Amendment of Clause I of Section XI of Chapter 598 of the Public Laws, 1866, as amended, relating to the Probate Court of the City of Providence.

Councilman Anthony B. Sciarretta and John B. Kelaghan, Esquire, were nominated for the remainder of the term ending on the First Thursday in November, 1977, at the regular meeting of the City Council held on Thursday, May 3, 1973, which date has allowed for the elapsed time of twenty days between nomination and the election of a Judge of Probate Court, to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Francis B. Brown, Esquire, former Judge of the said Court.

Gentlemen:

Your Committee, to which was referred that Resolution requesting the Committee on Public Welfare to investigate the licensing of Neutaconkanut Park in conjunction with the 1972 National Industrial Slow Pitch Softball Tournament, respectfully reports that it has conducted the investigation so requested concerning the leasing of a portion of Neutaconkanut Park for the baseball games played in conjunction with the 1972 National Industrial Slow Pitch Softball Tournament held over the Labor Day Weekend, 1972.

Your Committee respectfully reports that it was not the intention of the Department of Recreation that the said leasing planned the games be played all night, as was the case. This could not have been previously determined and was not

planned as such and was caused by inclement weather in the form of rain which fell all day on the Friday prior to the scheduled tournament of the weekend. Although the time element was a part of the lease, and not abided by the tourney officials, it must be kept in mind this was a world Tournament and scheduled once in every decade at a particular place and, therefore, had to be conducted within the time of the leasehold.

Your Committee respectfully reports that the recommendation of the Acting Director of the Department of Recreation, Joseph P. Hassett, as to future leasings of any City Owned recreational facility, is incorporated in a communication dated May 21, 1973, a copy of which is attached hereto,

and further that in accordance with the provisions of Resolution of the City Council No. 99, approved March 9, 1973, a copy of which is hereto attached, your Committee is authorized to grant permission for all future night sports events providing said event not be scheduled between the hours of 8:00 o'clock P.M. and 8:00 o'clock A.M., this controlling in effect, a repetition of such an occurrence of 1972.

Whereas, His Honor, Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., Mayor of the City of Providence, under the provisions of the Public Laws of 1940, Chapter 832, Section 50, being of the opinion that the

good of the City requires that the City Council shall meet at an earlier date than that to which said City Council stands adjourned, for the purpose of effecting the assessment and collection of all the 1973 taxes for the City of Providence, which effects the certification of the Tax Roll not later than June 15, 1973, has requested, in writing, that the City Clerk shall call a Special Meeting of said City Council.

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate, and tangible personal property in a sum not less than Forty Six Million, Four Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Forty Five Dollars (\$46,429,545.00), nor more than Fifty Million, Eight Hundred Forty One Thou-

sand, Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$50,841,-580.00); said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1972 at midnight, Eastern Standard Time, according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1973, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxes to each person, the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment, assessed against each person, also the amount of manufacturers' machinery and equipment and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate, personal estate and manufacturers' machinery and equipment to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of July 1973 next, and the twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1973 next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five percentum on or before the twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1973, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1973; Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of January, A.D. 1974; and Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-

fourth day of April, A.D. 1974. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest.

If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum. The City Collector, shall by advertisement, in the public newspapers of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1973, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excepted, at his office from eight-thirty o'clock A.M. to four-thirty o'clock P.M. to receive said taxes.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect as an Emergency Ordinance upon its passage.
