Done by J. H. H. S. Co.

Construction:

Sign to be constructed of 24 Gauge Sheet Iron, reinforced with 2" x 2" x 1/4" angle iron frame work.
Sign to span entrance, approximately 17' and extend 10' over the sidewalk.

The attraction signs will be approximately 6' x 28'

The front panel connecting to the two attraction signs will be 6' x 4'

The advertising opening will be 10' x 4'.

The attraction front is of the Adler Company design, with white opal glass and brackets to accommodate 3 lines of 8" lettering.

The letters for the attraction face to be of plastic (your choice of two colors).

The attraction sign to each be lighted with 10 General Electric Fluorescent 4' lamps and powered by 5 General Electric Ballasts, which operate to full capacity up to -10° below zero. The lamps, cool white of 40 Watt capacity.

The vertical ends and centers of the attraction signs will be lighted by 3 rows of Neon Tubing.

The Top and Bottom of the Attraction Sign to be lighted by a double row of 10 Watt bulbs, as a running border, flashing from the Center to the ends on both sides.

The letters for the attraction face to be of plastic (your choice of two colors).

The attraction Sign to each be lighted with 10 General Electric Fluorescent 4' lamps and powered by 5 General Electric Ballasts, which operate to full capacity up to -10° below zero. The lamps, cool white of 40 Watt capacity.

The vertical ends and centers of the attraction signs will be lighted by 3 rows of Neon Tubing.

The Top and Bottom of the Attraction Sign to be lighted by a double row of 10 Watt bulbs, as a running border, flashing from the Center to the ends on both sides.

The vertical ends and centers of the attraction signs will be lighted by 3 rows of neon tubing.

The top and bottom of the attraction sign to be lighted by a double row of 20 watt bulbs, as a running border, flashing from the center to the ends on both sides.

The letter U in center panel to be 3' in height, outlined with neon tubing and flashing bulbs (2 row) in the face of the reversed channel letter, mounted on brackets, to the face of the sign.

Vertical background on the front attraction sign to be of stainless steel.

The name UPSON on the top of the attraction sign will be in height, 2 1/2" to 1 1/2" on the small letters.

The channel letters will be made of 24 gauge sheet iron, recessed two inches in the face, to hold the outlined neon tubing.

All neon tubing to be powered by General Electric Transformers.

ASSESSOR'S PLAT 76

Gentlemen:

This referral is a request by the City to purchase a portion of Lot 505 on Assessor's Plat 76. The area in question contains approximately 220.104 square feet.

On the field trip it was found that this portion of Lot 505 is located at the rear of Esek Hopkins Junior High School, and this area is no longer used for this water bed due to a new channel that was constructed.

Since the Louisquisset Expressway has taken a portion of Hopkins Park play area the enlargement of Metcalf field becomes a more important factor, also, our Master Plan calls for this playfield enlargement. Therefore, it is recommended by the City Plan Commission staff that the City purchase this area for the enlargement of Metcalf field.

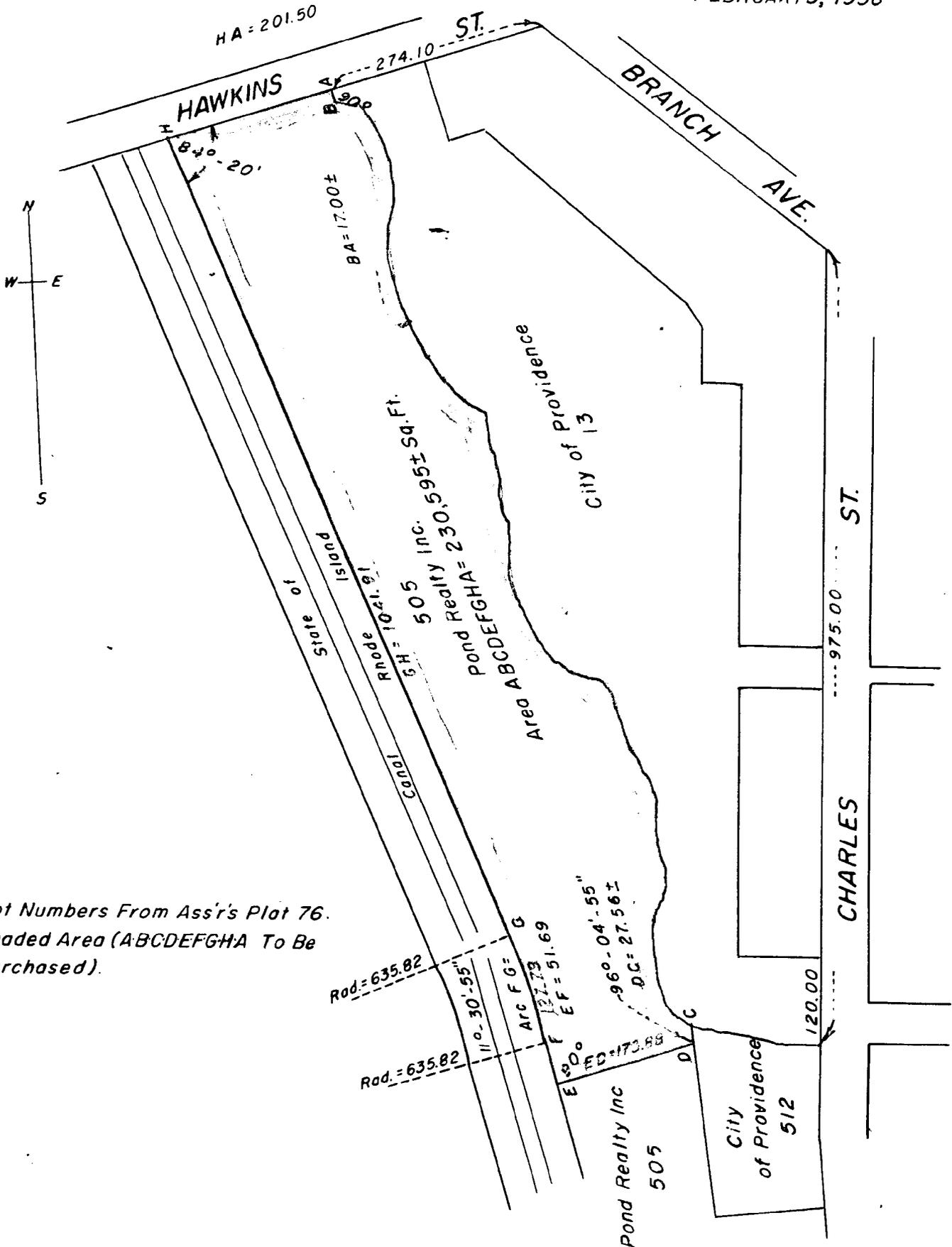

Whereas, John J. McGrane was called to his Eternal Reward on April 12, 1958 at the age of 64 years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McGrane was a native of Providence and a life long resident of the Elmwood section, a son of the late Lawrence A. and C. Theresa (Tully) McGrane; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McGrane, a practicing attorney in this city for the past 33 years, was educated in our local public schools, English High School and Georgetown University Law School where he earned his Law Degree; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McGrane had the distinction of being one of the youngest men ever elected to the State Senate where, at the time, he was the sole representative of the entire city of Providence, and held office during the 1923-1924 session when the historic filibuster took place.

WHEREAS, his proven ability and gracious personality resulted in his election to the Board of Alderman of this city where he served during 1933 and 1934 with honor and distinction; and

WHEREAS, he was a World War I veteran, one of the founders of Sylvester S. Payne Post, V.F.W. and the first commander of the State Department of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Rhode Island; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McGrane had been a member of the State Board of Elections and in recent years was public defender of indigent persons accused of crime, and gave untiringly of his time and talents in this direction; and

WHEREAS, members of this Honorable Body desire to express their sincere sympathy in the death of a very faithful and conscientious public servant who served his city, state and country so admirably;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor Walter H. Reynolds and the members of the City Council hereby extend to Mrs. McGrane and his family their profound regret in the great loss they have sustained; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be spread on the permanent records of this City Council and a copy hereof be forwarded to Mrs. Miriam G. McGrane.

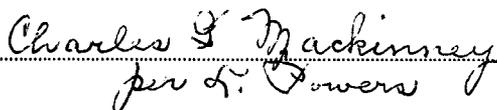

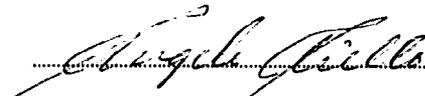

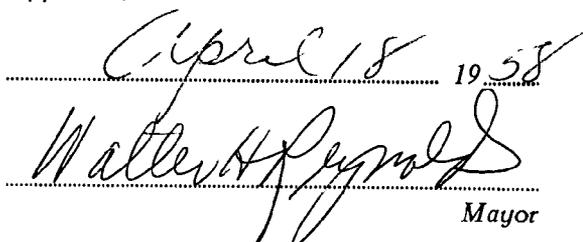

the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Inspector of Buildings subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated, viz:

Ward 11: Louis Adler, 217 Prairie Avenue, Plat 45, Lot 237, 2-5,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks and 1-500 gallon waste oil storage tank, making a total storage capacity of 10,500 gallons upon the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Inspector of Buildings or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.

Dear Sir:

At a meeting of the Zoning Board of Review held on Tuesday, March 10, 1950, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, Louis Adler, owner of Lot 237 on Assessor's Plat 45 on the northwesterly corner of Prudic Avenue and Robinson Street (217 Prudic Avenue) in a Commercial C-2 Zone, on February 25, 1950, filed an application for permission to erect a gasoline service station with three fuel pumps and to install two 5,000 gallon and one 500 gallon underground storage tanks and to be relieved from the corner set back requirements in the proposed erection of a steel sign pole on the above described premises, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on this application by the Zoning Board of Review at its meeting held on Tuesday, March 10, 1950, after public notice as provided by the Zoning Ordinance,

RESOLVED: That the Zoning Board of Review does hereby make a variation of the use district regulations under the Zoning Ordinance and does hereby grant the application of Louis Adler in accordance with the plans and plot plan filed with said Board.
